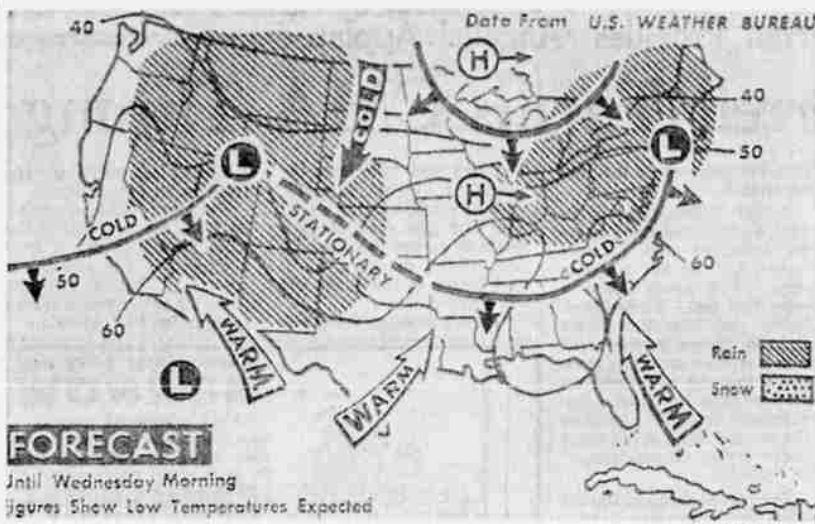

U of O Library Day Contest Entry Deadline Wednesday

A total of \$570 in cash and book awards will be given winners of a Library Day prize contest at the University of Oregon.

Students will submit their personal libraries in one of 22 categories for competition. Libraries will be judged on the selection of titles rather than on total number of monetary value. According to judging criteria, the library should indicate a future collection, balanced and broadly selected, which will be worthy of a place in the library of a well-educated person.

Deadline for entering the contest is 5 p.m. standard, 8 p.m. daylight Wednesday. All students, undergraduate and graduate, at the university are eligible. Entries are limited to 50 titles for each category. Each

book must bear a definite mark of ownership. Paper back books may be included, and students may enter more than one library in various categories. A list of rules may be obtained at the university library.

Judging will take place May 12.
