

Tri-Cities Star Has .413 Mark

Martin Paces Batters

Neil Martin of the league-leading Tri-Cities Braves is the leading hitter in the Northwest League for games through last Tuesday, according to statistician Bill Weiss of San Mateo, Calif.

Martin is not only hitting .413, but teammate Bob Rudd is second at .395. Martin leads in hits with 19 and is tied with

Rudd for runs with 14. Rudd leads with 16 runs batted in and with 33 total bases and is tied with Billy Cowan of Wenatchee with four home runs.

The Tri-Cities Braves open a three-game series against the Emeralds at Bethel Park Tuesday. The Braves boast a .313 team batting average to Eugene's .241 and fourth place.

Wenatchee leads in fielding at .961 with Tri-Cities second with .957 and Eugene fourth at .952.

Two Salem pitchers boast zero earned-run averages and Bruce Brubaker of Yakima has the most strikeouts with 29.

UO Spikers Seek Far West Crown

Coach Bill Bowerman's powerful Oregon track and field team goes after its ninth consecutive Far West championship Saturday when the Webfoots host the annual meet at Hayward Field.

The Webfoots, rated by many as the team to beat in the NCAA championships on the same field in mid-June, must take the measure of Oregon

State, Washington State, Washington, and Idaho to wrap up their ninth straight Far West crown.

Oregon's title bid will be spearheaded by distance great Deyrol Burleson, star hurdler Jerry Tarr, and sprint ace Harry Jerome, all double winners in their specialties last year as the Ducks captured their eighth successive Far West title.

The meet program will be changed slightly to conform with the NCAA meet schedule. The three-mile run replaces the two-mile jaunt, the 440-yard intermediate hurdles will be substituted for the low hurdles and the steeplechase will be added to the program.

The meet is scheduled for a 12:30 p.m. standard, 1:30 p.m. daylight starting time in the field events with the steeplechase slated to get under way at 1:45 p.m. There are a limited number of reserved seats left at \$2 and general admission tickets will be priced at \$1.50 for adults and 50 cents for all students through college age.

Coach Don Kirsch's baseball team starts its crucial six-game northern swing next week by meeting Idaho at Moscow Wednesday and Thursday and Washington State at Pullman Friday and Saturday. The Ducks, with a 4-3 Northern Division record, could vault into championship contention with a good performance on the road trip.

In tennis, Coach Dick Williams takes the Webfoot netters to Pullman for the Far West Championships Friday and Saturday.
