Picture Previews

Film Fare Varied At Area Theaters

Today's a good day to take Mom to the movies. But you'd better make sure that she has nerves of steel, a strong heart and enjoys a good, rousing movie, as that's the movie fare in the Eugene-Springfield area.

For a touch of irony, at least in the title, take Mom to "Woman Hunt" at the McKenzie. This is a murder mystery, and deals with a dead man who apparently returns to "get" his own killer. Berry Kroeger and Steven Piccaro star.

Its co-feature is "Splendor in the Grass," with Natalie Wood and Warren Beatty in a story of young lovers in a small town. Parents, in this film, are not the heroes.

If Mom likes Edgar Allan Poe, a version of one of his stories, "The Premature Burial," will play today through Tuesday at the Fox Theatre, with Ray Milland in the lead role. Co-featured with it is a tale of the Devil worship cult in the Caribbean, "The Devil's Hand."

The McDonald Theatre is featuring an unusual western, "The Man Who Shot Liberty Bells," James Stewart, John Wayne, Vera Miles, Lee Marvin and Edmond O'Brien star. The co-feature is "Brushfire," a film about guerrilla warfare in south-east Asia.

The Heilig and the Eugene Drive-In have a science fiction offering, playing through Tuesday. This is "The Day the Earth Caught Fire," and there are no guarantees that this will produce nightmares, but it seems a safe bet. Janet Munro, Leo McKern and Edward Judd star. Co-feature is "Six Black Horses," a western starring Dan Duryea and Audie Murphy.

One of Hollywood's most touted young actors, Maximilian Schell, and a cast top veteran performers are starred in "Judgment at Nuremberg," the movie that won Schell an Oscar this year.

The movie will open in Eugene Wednesday at the McDonald.

Produced by United Artists after long research, the movie — much of it set in a courtroom

— is based on the war crimes trials at Nuremberg, Germany, after World War II.

In addition to Schell, starring roles are held by Spencer Tracy, Burt Lancaster, Richard Widmark, Marlene Dietrich, Judy Garland and Montgomery Clift.

Also opening Wednesday will be a boy-meets-girl film, set in Italy, and a terror-filled film, starring Gregory Peck and Robert Mitchum.

The light-hearted film is "Rome Adventure," starring Troy Donahue, Suzanne Pleshette and Angie Dickinson and playing at the Fox. Miss Pleshette is cast as a librarian who quits her job after an argument over censorship and takes off for Italy, where life is a little more liberal. Donahue becomes the love interest, and Miss Dickinson provides the third side to a triangle.

Its co-feature is "Damn Yankees," a musical comedy starring Doris Day.

The mystery is "Cape Fear," which reviewers indicate is a well-written suspense drama. In addition to Peck and Mitchum, Polly Bergen is starred. The story is set in a Georgia town, where Mitchum, a psychopathic sex-criminal in the film, returns to harrass the lawyer who sent him to jail. Peck, the lawyer, and his family are terrorized by the ex-convict, and the police can't help.

"Everything But the Truth" is the co-feature and both are booked at the Heilig and the Eugene Drive-In, starting Wednesday.
