Two Eugene Men to Debate New Hospital Issue

Today's best bet for television viewing involves a debate on a controversial local issue, "Should Eugene Have Another Hospital?" with two Eugeneans participating in the half-hour program.

Scheduled for viewing at 2 p.m. on Channel 9's Jaycee Spotlight, Martin Brandenfeld, attorney representing the new private hospital, and Gordon Rennie, director of expansion for Sacred Heart Hospital, will debate the issue.

4 p.m., Issues and Answers (9)—Sen. J. William Fulbright, D-Ark., chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, will discuss several critical areas of U.S. foreign policy.

5 p.m., Wide World of Sports (9)—The Football Assn. Cup Soccer Championship at Wembley Stadium, London, will be presented.

6 p.m., Twentieth Century (6)—a repeat of "City Under the Ice" in which the U.S. Army

builds a city 30 feet under the ice.

6 p.m., Meet the Press (13-8)—Under Secretary of State George W. Ball is interviewed by a panel of newsmen on the administration's trade legislation and the European Common Market.

7:30 p.m., Walt Disney (13-8)—Morlan Nelson, one of the top-ranking falconers in America, will demonstrate the ancient sport of falconry in a preface to "Rusty and the Falcon."

8 p.m., Ed Sullivan (6)—Bobby Darin, who was unable to appear last week as planned, will appear tonight. Other guests will be Nancy Walker, Jaye P. Morgan, the Jamaican Newcomers, pianist Howard Butler and singer Bobby Weston.

10 p.m., DuPont Show (13-8)—Art Carney both narrates and performs on a one-hour musical comedy about some of the crazes that have swept the country.

3:30 p.m. (8)—"Girl In The Woods." Forrest Tucker, Barton MacLane. Two-fisted but tongue-tied yarn of the logging country and the passions and problems

of lumberjacks and their women. (1957—fair).

4:30 p.m. (2)—"Chad Hanna." Henry Fonda, Dorothy Lamour, Linda Darnell. Story of circus life in the mid-19th century was fairly good in 1940 but we've had so many colorful circus films since that this one, in black and white, is boring. (1940—fair).

7:30 p.m. (2)—"Carbine Williams." James Stewart, Jean Hagen, Wendell Corey. Based on fact, this is an engrossing personal drama of the man who invented and improved the Car-

bine Rifle for use by the Armed Forces. Stewart is effective in the lead role. (1952—good).

8:30 p.m. (9-12) — "Man of the West." Gary Cooper, Julie London, Lee Cobb. A gunslinger-bandit reforms, but chance brings him face to face with the leader of his former gang and he is forced to attempt a hold-up. (1959—no rating available).

10:30 p.m. (2)—"Hold Back the Night." John Wayne, Peter Graves, Chuck Connors. A Marine officer with his faithful bottle of Scotch fights his way through the Korean War. (1956—no rating available).
