NATIONAL FOREST TIMBER FOR SALE Abundant Creek Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Eugene, Oregon, beginning at 9:30 a.m., P.S.T., June 22, 1962, for all merchantable timber marked or designated for cutting on an area embracing 168 acres, or less, within Section 2, 3, 4 and 11, T. 23 S., R. 5 E., W.M., unreserved, in the Willamette National Forest, Oregon. The estimated volumes are: 6,100 M board feet of Douglas-fir hemlock and other species, and 850 M board feet of cedar. The minimum acceptable bid per M board feet is as follows: Douglas-fir \$16.25, Western hemlock and other species \$7.15, and cedar \$7.25. This includes the following rates, per M board feet for stumpage including deposit for sale area betterment: \$5.00 base rate plus an additional \$2.00 for Douglas-fir, \$2.00 base rate plus an additional \$3.00 for Western hemlock and other species, \$6.00 base rate plus an additional \$1.00 for cedar. The base rate plus an additional \$0.90 for Western hemlock and other species and \$0.45 for cedar disposal for all species. In addition there is a slash disposal fee of \$0.25 per M board feet which includes required deposit for sale area betterment, plus \$0.65 for slash disposal. The price bid for slash disposal shall be considered as tentative rates subject to quarterly calendar adjustment upward or downward by 0.5 of the difference between the average of the monthly Douglas-fir region indices, as calculated by the Forest Service for the three previous months, and the following base indices: Douglas-fir 110.95 and Western hemlock and other species 89.54(A). Such adjustments in the price for stumpage shall be applicable to timber sales during the quarter following the quarter for which the adjustment is computed. In no event, however, shall the price bid for slash disposal be less than the base rates as stated above. When the adjusted rates by species are lower than the base rates, the difference between the total dollar value of the timber cut at adjusted rates and the base rates will be accumulated and applied to the subsequent quarter. If the adjusted rates will develop an accumulated total dollar value for the species in excess of the base rates, the accumulated difference shall be publicly opened and posted, at the Post Office Building, Eugene, Oregon, on May 22, 1962. All those who submitted a satisfactory sealed bid will be permitted to continue auction bidding. A cash deposit of \$250.00 shall be submitted by the bidder immediately upon the opening of the sealed bid. The bidder must accompany each bid with a check for \$250.00 to accompany each bid, to be applied to the purchase price of the timber cut at adjusted rates. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form.
