Business Beat Tourist Season Off to Good Start

Oregon's tourist season appears to be off to a bustling start this year, judging from figures just released by the State Highway Department showing that 850 out-of-state tourists visited the Capitol in Salem last month.

That number is nearly four times as many as visited the capitol in April, 1961, when 219 out-of-state tourists signed the visitor list.

Of the 850 visitors last month, 94 were from foreign countries compared to 65 last year. The greatest number of sight-seers—308 of them—came from California, compared to only 39 from that state one year ago.

Many of the visitors indicated they are including Oregon and the Seattle Worlds Fair in a Northwest vacation tour, the department reports.

AID TO FUND DRIVE — The annual fund drive by the Mental Health Assn. of Oregon is receiving help from the 7-Up Bottling Co. in Eugene, whose truck drivers have distributed some 700 donation canisters throughout Lane County.

GERALD "SPECK" MURRAY, manager in Eugene, said drivers will pick up the canisters again when the drive is concluded at the end of this month. They will be deposited in a bank in the name of the association.

KOKE CONTRACT AWARDED — Construction is expected to start this week on the new Koke Printing & Lithography Co. printing shop and office building at 725 McKinley St., in Eugene's industrial tract.

According to architects for the new building, Balzhiser, Seder & Rhodes of Eugene, a contract for the job was awarded Friday to Eugene contractor John Steinmuller on a submitted bid totaling \$84,916. Four other bids ranged to a high of \$89,000.

The new 10,300-square-foot building will be built of concrete blocks. It will include a printing shop, offices, a small lab and darkroom, and an off-street parking area for about 27 cars.

The project is expected to be completed by Sept. 1.

SHOPPING CENTER PURCHASED — The Emerald Shopping Center at 911-923 River Rd., Eugene, has been purchased by Eugene insurance man J. Norman Bennett for an announced price of about \$100,000. Former owner is Thomas Winn. The sale was completed last month.

The center, about eight years old, has 11 business spaces, of which nine are now occupied, including the Bennett Insurance Agency.

Eugene architects Bogen, Hoseny & Greene have been retained to draw up a long-range development plan which will ultimately include construction of one more unit, Bennett said.
