

2nd Church To Participate In Program

Plans Announced By Congregation

Allison Park Christian Church, 1520 Echo Hollow Road, Eugene, announced this week that the church will participate in the All-Church Evangelism program.

ACE, directed and founded by the Rev. Bayne Driskill, now in Eugene to set up ACE's first district office at the First Christian Church, is a congregation membership building program. It differs from the usual evangelistic campaign in that members of the congregation spend six months in preparing themselves and their prospective members for a "day of decision," when the prospects actually join the church.

An intensive and comprehensive follow-up program for the new members follows the "day of decision."

Allison Park will hold its organizational meeting for the program Sunday at 9:45 a.m. standard, 10:45 a.m. daylight, during the regular Sunday school hour. All church members are urged by the pastor, the Rev. Ray Biggers, to be present, as a certain percentage of attendance is required at this session.

Decision day is set for Oct. 14. Allison Park will be the second Eugene area church to join in the program. First Christian Church of Eugene joined earlier, but will have its "day of decision" later in October than Allison Park.

Guest speaker this Sunday at 11 a.m. standard, noon daylight, will be Abraham Abaka, a student from the Congo now at the University of Oregon.

Translating for Abaka, who will speak in his native language, will be Hattis Mitchell of Springfield, a retired missionary to the Congo.

A potluck dinner is planned after the service, and the congregation's annual meeting, with election of officers, will be held Sunday afternoon.

On Wednesday morning, the church will have a "sweetheart breakfast," for all members of the church and friends. Members of the church who are graduating seniors will be honored. The breakfast is scheduled to begin at 7:30 a.m. standard, 8:30 a.m. daylight, at the church.

An Alabama pastor, the Rev. Gene Walley, will be in Eugene through June 3 to conduct a series of revival programs.

He will be speaking at Fairfield Baptist Church, 3991 Elmira Rd., Eugene. Sunday services are scheduled at 11 a.m. and 8 p.m. standard, noon and 9 p.m. daylight, and the weekday services will begin at 7:30 p.m. standard, 8:30 p.m. daylight.

The Rev. Walley is pastor of Crawford Baptist Church, Mobile, Ala.

Dedication Services Set For Church

Dedication services will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. standard, 3 p.m. daylight, for the new sanctuary at Rainbow Valley Christian Church.

The sanctuary, located on Pine Grove Road about ten miles southwest of Eugene, was constructed with the aid of donated materials and volunteer labor, with George Ashley of the congregation in charge.

Among those participating in Sunday's dedication service will be Ross Griffith, president of Northwest Christian College in Eugene; the Rev. Carlton Buck, pastor of First Christian Church, Eugene; Guy Wright and William Siefke of the NCC faculty and administration; Leo Woodruff, pastor of University Street Church of Christ and also representing the Eugene Ministerial Assn.; Lynnton Elwell, pastor of West Side Church of Christ, and Donald McGavran, head of NCC's Institute of Church Growth.

Neal J. King, pastor of the church, and Gary Hall, an NCC student who is youth minister, will also participate.

Norman Towne of Rainbow Valley is chairman of the church board, and Mrs. Towne is secretary. Mrs. John Camp is treasurer. Special music at Sunday's program will be provided by Ivadean Evans.

Rainbow Valley Church has been organized for some time, and until recently services were held in the old Pine Grove School. The new sanctuary will be converted to a parsonage in the future when the congregation's building plans are completely carried out.

The new building, which features mahogany paneling in the chancel, will seat some 150 persons.

Rainbow Valley has been a preaching point for NCC students since 1953.

Demand for Bibles Rises

Demand for the Bible rises dramatically during periods of political unrest, the board of managers of the American Bible Assn. said in its recent annual report.

The board pointed to Cuba and Congo as examples. In Cuba, distribution increased in 1961 from 611,993 Bibles to 906,660. And in the Congo, there was an increase in demand of 75,000 Bibles.

But 1961 was a "big" year for the society in other countries as well. A record number of Bibles — 24 million copies — were distributed during 1961, in the United States and in 100 other countries on six continents. More than 11 million Bibles were distributed overseas, the board reported.
