

At Flemming News Conference Teaching Institute For UO Discussed

Formal training in methods of teaching can be a great help to graduate students planning academic careers, Arthur S. Flemming, president of the University of Oregon, said Wednesday.

Flemming, speaking at a news conference, discussed plans for establishment of an Institute for College Teaching at the University of Oregon. The Board of Higher Education has approved the institute, and it will begin operation Jan. 1, 1963.

During the news conference Flemming also talked about expansion of the Oregon campus to meet growing enrollment.

William C. Jones, UO dean of administration, will direct the Institute for College Teaching, in addition to his other duties. Dean Jones will be on leave to Harvard University next fall, Flemming said, and will have the opportunity to study a program for college teachers in operation at Harvard.

To Organize Programs
The institute will organize systematic programs for future

college teaching, Flemming said.

Flemming quoted Harry Alpert, dean of the UO Graduate School, on the need for such training.

A doctor's degree is usually considered as a license to teach in college, Alpert said, "But whether the holder of the degree has any preparation for college teaching has been almost a matter of chance."

The institute will offer two types of programs: One will include courses on supervised college teaching, conducted through individual departments. The other type will be elective courses concerning the organization and objectives of colleges and universities.

Advanced-Degree Students

Most of the students in the institute, Flemming said, will be those working for advanced degrees, who are planning to make college teaching a career.

Turning to the discussion of campus expansion and building, Flemming said the Board of Higher Education would take this up at a future meeting. Plans discussed by university and Eugene city officials last week, Flemming said, while not definite, do present an idea of the university's future needs. Lawrence Lackey, planning consultant for the university, presented a long-range plan to the Eugene City Council calling for expansion on every edge of the campus except its western border.

"Mr. Lackey has given us a start," Flemming said. "We are not going to freeze any of these ideas at this particular point."

Severe Financial Problem

The university, Flemming said, like other divisions of the State System of Higher Education, is faced with a severe financial problem. The Board of Higher Education is to consider a \$45 million building program for the entire system at its July meeting, Flemming said.

A bond issue may prove to be the most feasible way to finance such a large building program, Flemming said, since that would spread the payment over many generations.

"And the buildings we are talking about can be used for three, four or even more generations," the president said.
