Dry-Cleaning Hints Given

Drop your money in the slot if you'd be your own "home-styled" dry cleaner. But not before you know a thing or two about how far you go with these miracle vats of solvent, says Miss Virginia Houtchens, Lane extension agent.

"Not everything in your closet can be reduced to a common denominator in the coin-operated dry cleaner," she warns. "You face the same problems of the commercial dry cleaner—fabrics that fade, lint, or lose their pattern; belts and buttons that turn sticky in solvent; stains and spots that require professional know-how."

You can't expect the same service from the coin-operated dry cleaner you get from the commercial establishment. And if you're in doubt about a fabric, a stain or a color, play it safe by sending the garment to your regular dry cleaner.

However, the homemaker's warm reception of coin-operated dry cleaners is the best proof of her satisfaction—in money and time saved—"doing it herself."

The solvent used in the coin-operated cleaner is the same used by most commercial cleaners. The solvent is filtered and re-used—with the attendant checking it daily for detergent content, fatty content, and moisture.

Miss Houtchens makes these suggestions:

DO NOT DRYCLEAN: Suede, leather or natural fur; plastics, elastic, angora, simulated leather, flock prints, rubber or foam rubber; fibre glass.

If in doubt about a fabric's

color - fastness, test dye for "bleeding" with a small amount of perchlorethylene (available from the attendant).

"Problem colors are usually red, blue, pink, and orange—depending upon the fabric and type of dye," Miss Houtchens explains.

Then there's the matter of "spots" and "stains." A stained garment usually requires the attention of the commercial dry cleaner. Use of a "fog gun" (also available from the attendant) may be used to spray perspiration areas or spots of water soluble soil.

Other reminders:

SWEATERS: Turn, button, and place in mesh bag or pillow case.

ZIPPER: Close except in jackets before cleaning.

BUTTONS: Test first with solvent. If sticky, remove before cleaning.

BELTS: Test lining with solvent. If sticky, don't clean.

ORNAMENTS: Remove first. The solvent is apt to dissolve the glue holding the jewels.

NECKTIES: Place in bag.

ARTICLES THAT LINT: Wash separately, never with dark colors.

DRAPERIES: Drycleaning is not guaranteed... especially

for those long exposed to strong sunlight.

However, if you decide to clean your draperies:

• Ask attendant for instructions.

• If possible, test clean a sample of the drapery material.

• Remove hooks from draperies.

• Remove draperies from cleaner the minute the machine stops to avoid excessive wrinkling.

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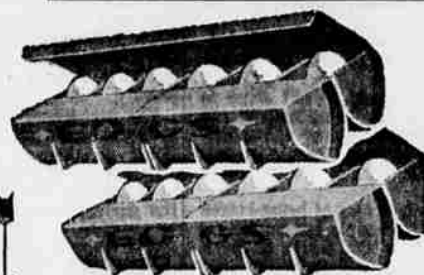

Robertsons Plan Annual Reunion

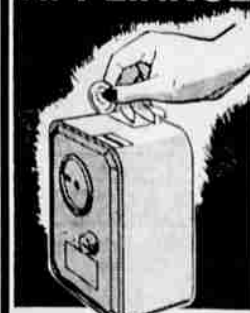
