Lawmaker Can't Find Power Fight

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A Florida congressman probed unsuccessfully Tuesday for evidence of a public and private power struggle over the Bonneville Power System in the Pacific Northwest.
 He was told flatly that no such fight existed.
 Questioning by Rep. James A. Haley, D-Fla., at a House Reclamation subcommittee hearing led to assurances by Rep. Jack Westland, R-Wash., that private and public power worked peacefully together in the area.
 Westland came to the support of Gus Norwood, executive secretary of the Northwest Public Power Assn., who had made a similar claim.

Haley was questioning Norwood during a hearing on bills to guarantee the Pacific Northwest first call to its power in the event a transmission line is built to connect the BPA system with California's federal power system.

Norwood said the bills were supported by industry because it would help protect their power supply. He said the public power group he represented would support the legislation whether the proposed intertie were built by private or federal agencies.

Westland came to Norwood's support, saying that the Pacific Northwest was unique "in that private and public power 'get along.' He noted that the guarantee legislation had the support of both private and public power.

Strawberry Crop Ready for Harvest

PORTLAND (AP)—The state employment service said Wednesday that if warm, fair weather continues, Willamette Valley strawberry growers will need 30,000 pickers by the middle of next week.
 Blain Christian, Portland office manager for the agency, said that about 20 per cent of Portland area strawberry growers now have pickers in the field.
