

Long Squall Line

Winds, Hail Belt
Areas of Nation

Violent thunderstorms, accompanied locally by destructive winds and hail, belted wide areas Monday night along a squall line stretching from Texas to the Great Lakes.

The most destructive storm, which spawned at least two tornadoes, battered the St. Louis area and then plowed northward across Illinois into Indiana. It left a path of toppled utility poles and trees.

The turbulent weather was triggered by cool air that dropped temperatures along the storm line as much as 30 de-

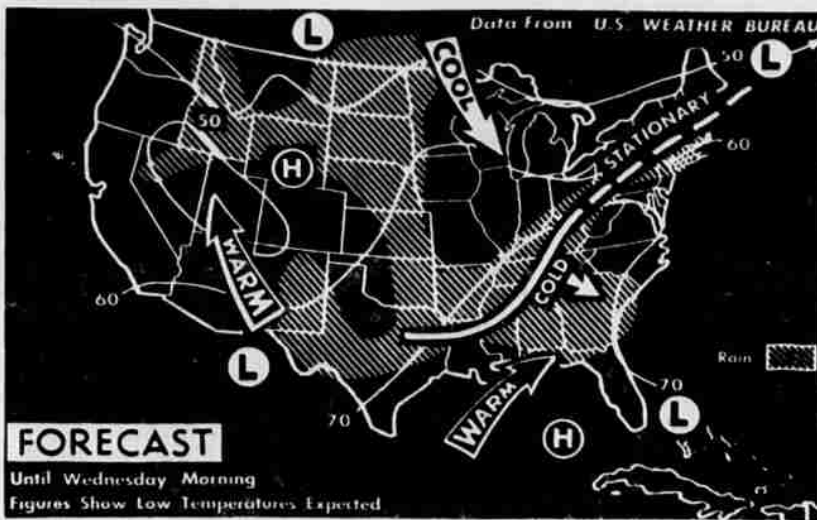
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Nice

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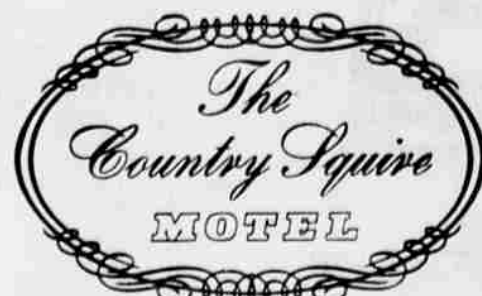
