Council Schedules Special Meeting

Ministerial and lay delegates from churches in Eugene and Springfield are invited to attend a special meeting of the Central Lane Council of Churches Thursday.

The meeting, open also to the general public, will begin at 7:30 p.m. standard, 8:30 p.m. daylight, at First Congregational Church, 1050 E. 23rd Ave., Eugene.

Thursday's meeting will be the second in the current reorganization program of the Council. The Rev. Lloyd Stamp of First Congregational is president of the Council.

He said that Thursday's meeting would involve further planning for the reorganization, and would include planning for two or three major projects next fall.

Minister to Open District Office Here

The Rev. J. Sydney Carnes, former minister of First Christian Church at Clarksville, Texas, has arrived in Eugene to open the first district office of All-Church Evangelism, Inc.

He will also serve part-time on the staff of First Christian Church, Eugene, where the district office headquarters are located.

The Rev. Carnes took his undergraduate studies at Memphis State University, Memphis, Tenn., his home town. He did graduate work at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas, and was ordained in 1949.

He has been working with ACE as a guest director and crusade speaker since 1951.

In his new post, he will be in charge of the ACE program in 11 western states. Through ACE, a program of the Disciples of Christ, churches hold six-month programs of evangelism, visitation, prayer and programs to build membership in the church and gain converts to Christianity.

Groundwork for the Eugene district office was done by ACE's founder, the Rev. Bayne Driskill, during several months of work here.

Two Eugene churches, First Christian in Eugene and Allison Park Christian Church, Echo Hollow Road, have already signed up for ACE programs.

The Rev. Carnes is married and has two children. At present, the family is living at 643 E. 12th Ave., Eugene.

The minister's brother, James Carnes of Salem, operates a business in Halsey.

An annual event, the coffee is held to raise funds for medical missions overseas. More than \$100,000 is raised each year by United Presbyterian Women by coffees and similar projects, to aid the demonstration's 56 hospitals in 15 countries.

Part of this year's offering will be spent to build a new operating unit at the Christian Hospital in Tabriz, Iran, and to do modernization work there.

OSU to Host Town, Church Conference

This year's 14th annual Town and Country Church Conference at Oregon State University, Corvallis, will have a "new look," conference officials said.

The Rev. Kenneth C. Larson of Corvallis, general chairman, said that the five-day meeting, scheduled Aug. 6-10, will be built around the idea of continuing education for the clergy, church lay leaders, community leaders and other interested in the town and country church.

To carry this out, the conference will emphasize three basic courses: Changes in Oregon agriculture and forestry, social and personal implications of community change and communications.

'Family Farm'

In addition to these "core" courses, general sessions will be held on the changing concept of the "family farm," rural areas development and resources available to local communities from land grant universities. Evening sessions will be devoted to family income and expenditures, music and community action through farm and home organizations.

Elective courses will be offered on visualizing a talk, church publicity programs, church flower arrangements and ideas for parties and recreation.

The Rev. Larson urged participating ministers and lay people to attend all sessions of the conference. Housing and meals for conference participants will be provided on the OSU campus, he said, and special arrangements can be made for family groups. A Corvallis church is planning to provide low-cost nursery and child care for participants.

Pre-registrations are due by Saturday, June 30. Registration information is available from the Rev. Loren H. Bush, recruitment chairman, Church of the Good Samaritan, 35th and Harrison Streets, Corvallis.

The conference is planned and sponsored by representatives of the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, state and local church women's organizations, denominational representatives of several churches, the Oregon Council of Churches, Oregon Farm Bureau Federation, Oregon-Washington Farmers Union, Oregon Home Economics Extension Council and Oregon State Grange, in cooperation with OSU and the Cooperative Extension Service.
