

Rusk, Home Discuss Red Chinese Buildup

LONDON (AP) — Secretary of State Dean Rusk and British Foreign Secretary Lord Home reportedly believe Red China's military buildup in Fukien Province does not foreshadow an attack on the Nationalist-held offshore islands. They think it may be meant to silence Chiang Kai-shek's threats to invade the mainland.

Spokesmen said Rusk and Home reached this conclusion Monday in wide-ranging talks that paid much attention to the Communist buildup opposite the Nationalist islands of Quemoy and Matsu, just off the Communist mainland.

In Peiping, Red China's Foreign Minister Chen Yi charged that the Nationalists are preparing with U.S. help for a large-scale invasion of the

Southeast China coast. The Communists continued to shell Quemoy and Matsu Monday night, lobbing 132 shells on Quemoy and 45 on Matsu.

The talks aligning British-American views on Communist threats and inter-allied problems followed Rusk's meetings with President Charles de Gaulle in Paris and Chancellor Konrad Adenauer in Bonn. Rusk's aides expressed belief his trip has helped clarify some misconceptions among chief allies of America over aspects of U.S. policy.

Rusk's round of talks heralded the start of a period of intensive maneuvering between the Communists and the Western powers.

The three Western Allies sent notes to Moscow Monday calling on the Soviet Union to join four-power talks in Berlin

to end violence along the Berlin wall and try to bring peace to the divided city.

Rusk and Home agreed to attend the signing next month of a 14-power pact being written at Geneva to guarantee the neutrality of Laos. If Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko also attends, it would provide an opportunity to confer anew on Berlin, disarmament, nuclear tests and other East-West problems.

Summing up the results of Rusk's trip so far, his aides said he had not come over to break up what has been called the Paris-Bonn axis because that would be against America's own interests.

He had not brought along any plan to help France's nuclear weapons program, but he gave assurances that America stands ready to help build up a multilateral European nuclear force dovetailed with American nuclear might.

Rusk told Home that De Gaulle had assured him that Britain's bid for entry into the flourishing Common Market would not be vetoed for political reasons. American diplomats feel that Britain's entry into the European Economic Community could provide the basis for setting up an American-backed nuclear strike force within the framework of the Atlantic alliance.

Assistant Secretary of State Robert Manning said development of multi-nation European nuclear deterrent was an evolutionary process that would require months of discussion within the North Atlantic Treaty Organization Council.

The U. S. position that the West needs a multilateral nuclear deterrent, operated on a single common policy, has raised a stir in British political and defense circles.

Quizzed About Entertainers

Senate Probe

Union Chief Raps Police Witnesses

WASHINGTON (AP) — The head of the American Guild of Variety Artists (AGVA) contends police witnesses have tried to make the union a "patsy" at Senate hearings for their own failure to clean up honky tonk night spots.

Jackie Bright, administrative secretary and operating head of the AFL-CIO union for entertainers, fired back at witnesses who had denounced him and had pictured the union as conniving with hoodlums in prostitution and other night life rackets.

Major Housecleaning

He said the Senate Investigations subcommittee's hearings have shown that the union needs a major housecleaning. He said that AGVA will "use downright force" to clean up some situations.

But he also branded some of the testimony as a series of lies, half-truths and misstatements "blown up beyond all normal proportions."

Bright accepted the subcommittee's invitation to take a lie-detector test.

The subcommittee is working against the clock to complete the inquiry and switch to hearings on the Billie Sol Estes case.

The subcommittee had heard two weeks of testimony in which some police officials and union members described AGVA as a do-nothing union — interested in collecting a million dollars a year of members' dues and initiation fees, but failing to protect girl entertainers from being forced into prostitution and drink hustling as B-girls.

Contracts Not Enforced

Some lower echelon union officials admitted that none of them had even enforced union contracts against such rackets.

Bright said he was amazed to hear such things.

He denied that any of the alleged abuses had occurred with his knowledge or consent.

Cigarette Believed Cause of Fatal Blaze

The fire which early Monday morning took the life of a Marcola woman is believed to have started in an upholstered chair.

Discord Ends Unity Talks On Congo

LEOPOLDVILLE, the Congo (AP) — Premier Cyrille Adoula and Katanga President Moise Tshombe ended six weeks of unity negotiations in discord Tuesday.

Tshombe left for Elisabethville. Adoula said peaceful talks have proved futile and called on the United Nations for more effective measures — their nature unspecified — to end Katanga's secession.

Quoting documents, Adoula told newsmen Tshombe's resistance to reunification had hardened rather than weakened. The two had 41 meetings.

"It was the United Nations which encouraged us to enter these negotiations," Adoula said. "We made our effort, now it is up to the United Nations to take the responsibility for restoring our unity."

Tshombe told newsmen much remains to be done and that the negotiations would continue. He said he had every intention of meeting again with Adoula in Leopoldville or "some other place." He gave no indication of when.

Parade Cancelled

FT. LEWIS, Wash. (AP) — Members of the 41st Infantry Division did not have to participate in the traditional Governor's Day parade during summer camp this year. The parade was cancelled so the 5,000 National Guardsmen from Oregon and Washington could attend the Seattle World's Fair.

U.S. Women Escape Injury When Reds Fire at 'Copters

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — The wife of U.S. Ambassador Frederick Nolting said she and the wife of American Commander Gen. Paul Harkins escaped injury Tuesday when a flight of helicopters in which they were riding was fired on by Communist guerrillas. The 5-year-old son of a Vietnamese army colonel was killed in the action.

Mrs. Nolting said a party of wives was being flown to the town of Bien Hoa, 15 miles north of Saigon, to see new quarters constructed there for families of Vietnamese 5th Division soldiers.

The helicopter carrying Mrs. Nolting, Danville, Va., and Mrs. Harkins, Mt. Pleasant, Iowa, was not hit by the Communist fire from the ground. But another

helicopter carrying the young son of Col. Truong Khue Quang, director of welfare services for the Vietnamese armed forces, was hit and the boy was wounded. He died on the way back to Saigon.

Mrs. Nolting told United Press International that the incident occurred when the two helicopters reached Bien Hoa and encountered difficulty in landing because of heavy fog.

She said the helicopter carrying herself and Mrs. Harkins hovered overhead, while the helicopter carrying Col. Quang and his 5- and 12-year-old sons flew in low to search for a landing pad.

As it did, it was hit by Communist ground fire, Mrs. Nolting said.

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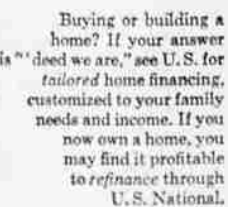
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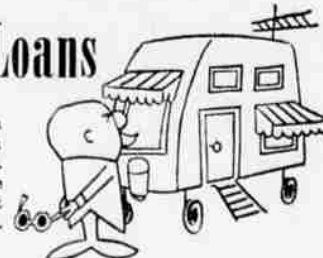
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
