NEW YORK (U)—Despite late from fractions to a point or so profit-taking, the stock market closed higher Friday. Trading was active.

Two buying waves accompanied by late ticker tapes gave the list a rally for two days running.

Volume for the day was estimated at 5 million shares compared with 5.44 million Thursday.

Gains of key stocks ran mostly

side, with General Motors up a fraction and Ford easy.

Aerospace issues, helped by contract news, and electronics made moderate gains.

At 1 p.m. the Dow Jones average of 30 industrials was up 7.24 to 564.59.

Prices were mostly higher in moderate trading on the American stock exchange.

U.S. government and corporate bonds were lower.

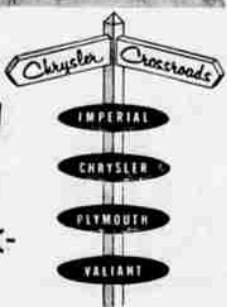
