

Hedlund OGA Medalist With 142

John Hedlund, prospective sophomore golfer for the University of Oregon, captured medalist honors in the Oregon Golf Assn. (OGA) match-play tournament at the Eugene Country Club Friday.

The two-time All-State prepper from Lake Oswego, who just turned 19 years of age in January, fired rounds of 73-69-142, two under par, to be the first of 142 men golfers to master the tough 6,700-yard layout.

"I guess the best part of my game was my driving, especially on the back nine," the lanky, ruddy-cheeked, bespectacled duckling driver said. "He's a heady player," host professional Wendell Wood said. The Oregon Ducks played the ECC course this season and Hedlund's best score was a 67 in a match

against Tillamook High. "I always knock down all of my putts," Hedlund said when asked about putting out in match play.

Best score was Hedlund's ever shot was a 58 at Oswego, a par-68 course. He has had a number of sub-par performances, including a 68 at Prineville.

Hedlund joined some fast company Saturday with the opening of match play, including Dick Price, defending champion from Longview, Wash., who did not elect to play for the medal. There were three other former champions who made the 32-man title flight, including Walker Cupper Bruce Cudd, who had a sub-par 71 Friday for a 147 total; Don Krieger, who added a 74 to a 77 for a 151, and George Beecher of Prineville who put a 77 along with a 78 for 155.

There are a number of

younger players who figure as potential champs, including two University of Oregon seniors, Jerry Cundari, who had 74-71-147, and Tom Shaw, 74-71-147. Two others who have played for Oregon

land, who duplicated Hedlund's 69 Friday and the OSU Rook finished with 148 after an initial 79.

Bob Shriver, Eugene surprise who had a 73 Thursday, shot an 81 Friday a victim of hay fever.

Hedlund may be the youngest golfer ever to win OGA medalist honors, but he definitely would not be the youngest champion, should he go all of the way. Both Don Moe and Cudd were champions at 18.

Six players at 156 were forced to play off for five final berths in the championship flight. It was almost an exclusive Eugene playoff that lasted only the first hole in a sudden-death playoff. Al Erickson of Eugene got off the tee badly and pushed his second, and though he had a good recovery, came up with double-bogey six. Larry Hiron and Byron Wood, both of

Eugene, qualified with par-4s, Frank Isaac and Jim Putney of Eugene and Bruce Cadwell of Seattle qualified with 5s.

The four favorites in the women's championships registered easy victories in first-round matches. Mrs. Mike (Carol Jo Kabler) Skala, the defending champion from Sutherland, playing out of Roseburg, was one over par while winning 6-5. Sue Jeanette, a former champion from Oswego, was pleased with her game—three under par for a 7-6 victory. June Robinson, recent intercollegiate medalist from Oregon State, was even par while winning 7-5.

Mrs. Ron (Shirley Siegmund) Mitchell of Chico, Calif., playing out of the Rogue Valley Country Club, Medford, had the most convincing victory, winning 8-7 while shooting one under par.

Slightly Behind Record Pace

Yang Tops Decathlon

TULARE, Calif. (AP)—Performing slightly behind record pace but with his strongest event yet to come, C. K. Yang takes a commanding lead into Saturday night's final events of the National AAU decathlon championships.

Yang, a native of Formosa and student at UCLA who finished second in the 1960 Olympic games, rolled up 4,636 points and won three events Friday in the first day's competition.

Rafel Johnson, who narrowly

beat Yang at the Olympics, scored 4,750 on his first day when he set the world record of 8,683 two years ago when this meet was held in Eugene, Ore.

Defending champion Paul Herman of Westmont College was second with 4,115 points and Russ Hodge of the U.S. Air Force third at 3,956. The first two Americans will compete against the U.S.S.R. in a dual meet July 21-22 at Stanford University.

Yang's victories Friday came

in the 100 meters, 400 meters and 1,500 meters, where he posted marks of 10.6 seconds, 48 seconds and 24 feet 2 1/2 inches. His strongest event, the 110 meter high hurdles, opens Saturday's program. Also carded are the discus, javelin, pole vault and 1,500 meter run.

Gerry Moro of the University of Oregon ranked distant 15th with 2,936 points, but his strongest events—the discus and the pole vault—are on Saturday's program and could boost him in the standings.

Steve Pauly of Oregon State was fifth with 3,700 points.

Sam Whitney, U.S. Army, Ft. San Houston, Tex., and former Oregon pole-vaulter, withdrew from competition.
