After a wedding trip to Lake Tahoe, the pair will be at home in San Francisco.



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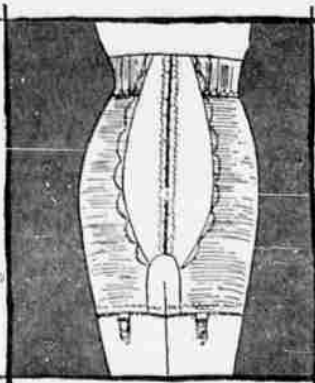


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
