

Conference On Urban Renewal Set

A national working conference on urban renewal will get under way Sunday evening on the University of Oregon campus.

The meeting, sponsored by the National Assn. of Housing and Redevelopment Officials (NAHRO), is expected to bring several hundred delegates to Eugene from all over the country.

The meeting will last through Tuesday. Among the speakers and panel discussion participants will be William L. Slayton, commissioner of the Urban Renewal Administration, and Neal J. Hardy, commissioner of the Federal Housing Administration. Minoru Yamasaki, internationally-known architect, from Detroit, Mich., will be one of the panel speakers.

Eugene and Springfield city officials and planning commission members have been invited to attend the conference.

UO Goethe Expert Gets Study Grant

Wolfgang A. Leppmann, professor of Germanic languages at the University of Oregon, has received a study grant from the Alexander von Humboldt Stiftung, foundation of the West German government.

Leppmann, who will spend the coming academic year in Germany under a Guggenheim Foundation grant, plans to study how the German author Goethe is represented to East Germans. The new grant will aid him in financing the study.

Leppmann is the author of two published books on the German author. He is currently working on a third.

Port Group Asks Maintenance Aid

REEDSPORT—Port of Umpqua Commissioners decided Tuesday to ask International Paper Co. to aid in the maintenance of the Gardiner boat ramp on the Umpqua River.

The port recently spent \$1,200 for partial dredging of the area near the ramp and according to a 1952 agreement Gardiner Lumber Co., now a part of International Paper, was to keep the river dredged to a depth of six feet.

Tuesday port commissioners requested attorney Orin Collier to contact International Paper officials about the matter.

Commissioners also announced that information regarding the port's 275-acre industrial plant site has been submitted to a firm hired by the Bonneville Power Administration.

The industrial site owned by the port is located on two adjoining islands in the Umpqua River between Reedsport and Gardiner and is undeveloped at the present.

Hatfield to Speak At Dedication

PORTLAND —Gov. Mark Hatfield will speak at the dedication of Hills Creek Dam on the middle fork of the Willamette River 45 miles southeast of Eugene Aug. 4.

This was announced by A. Warren Jones, executive secretary of the Willamette Basin Project Committee.

Ceremonies are to take place at the base of the Army Engineers' \$45.8 million project.

COTTAGE GROVE—Don Mason of Eugene has been named manager of the chamber of commerce here. He replaces Mrs. Thomas C. (Marjorie) Matthews, who has held the position for the last six years.

Mrs. Matthews is resigning to enter the antique business here. Mason, 32, said he was happy to have the new position. "It's only on a part-time basis now, but I expect it to be full-time later," he added.

Bids Invited On Dam Road

Bids have been asked on two projects by the U. S. Army Engineer District in Portland.

An opening date of July 19 has been set for bids to perform all work to complete a government contract defaulted for construction of the Walker Creek-Upper End Section of the Eastside Road at the Cougar Reservoir project.

The project is located on the South Fork McKenzie River, 18 miles southeast of Blue River and is expected to cost about \$75,000.

Bids will be opened July 13 for construction of exploratory drifts of Green Peter Dam site on the Middle Santiam River, 11 miles northeast of Sweet Home. The drifts are to be constructed to explore the dam's foundation.

Bids for the road contract, a Forest Service access road with turnouts on the right bank of the reservoir, also will be invited.

UO Professor's Work Published

An article by Robert S. Summers, assistant professor of law at the University of Oregon, appears in the latest issue of the Oregon Law Review, a quarterly published at the university.

The article reviews the business-purpose doctrine as applied in federal income taxation.

Another article by Summers will appear in the Journal of Legal Education. It concerns symbolic logic and law.

Harrisburg Youth To Undergo Surgery

Louis Keller, 18, of Harrisburg will enter the University of Oregon Medical School Hospital in Portland July 16 for open heart surgery on July 19.

Keller, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Keller of Harrisburg, has had a heart defect since birth. He had one operation for the condition when four years old.

Lane Cooperative Proposes Projects

A construction program costing an estimated \$188,000 has been recommended by Lane County Electric Cooperative's consulting engineers in a report to the cooperative's board of directors.

The board of directors is expected to approve the plans, according to Glen R. Sawyer, manager of the cooperative.

Major construction items recommended would provide increased capacity to deliver power to the Bailey Hill area southwest of Eugene and to customers in the McKenzie service area.

Most of the projects are scheduled for completion during the summer and fall of 1962, before the winter peak load period.

Major construction items recommended are:

- Construction of a new 216 mile three-phase feeder from the West 11th substation south to the Lorane Highway.

- A new switching station to be located near Blue River. Construction would be completed by October, when the Bonneville Power Administration's Blue River substation is energized.

Coburg Hearing

COBURG—A hearing for the 1962-63 city budget will be Monday at 8 p.m. standard, 9 p.m. daylight in city hall. The estimated budget for 1962-63 totals \$22,631.84.

The regular city council meeting will be held after the budget hearing.

- Installation of a 150 KVA transformer at the Cottage Grove substation in order to handle increasing power loads in that area.

Other construction recommendations include miscellaneous circuit changes to provide improved service and installation of voltage regulators to improve existing feeder capacity.

Financing of the improvements would be from money available and funds borrowed from the Rural Electrification Assn., Sawyer said.

The cooperative has approximately 6,000 customers and more than 800 miles of lines, mostly in rural areas of the county.

Roof Blown From Bin

A dust explosion blew a corrugated metal roof off a huge fuel bin at the Rosboro Lumber Co. in Springfield Friday noon, igniting "hogged" fuel which continued to smolder for several hours.

Paul Cole, company owner, said no one was in the masonry block structure when the dust exploded.

An employee in the sawmill, Robert Saul, said for an instant after the explosion "the whole roof looked like one big ball of fire."

Springfield firemen poured thousands of gallons of water into the bin which holds many tons of fuel.

Because the fuel bin is a separate structure, other portions of the company's operations were not threatened by the fire.

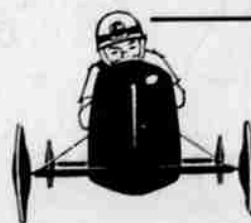
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
