

Senate OKs McCloskey

Democrats Defeat Demands for Probe

WASHINGTON (AP)—Matthew H. McCloskey, 69, Philadelphia contractor and former Democratic Party treasurer, will be packing soon for Dublin.

His nomination by President Kennedy as ambassador to Ireland was confirmed by the Senate by voice vote Thursday after Republican demands for further investigation by the Senate Foreign Relations Committee were rejected 62-30.

Democrats voted solidly against the motion by Sen. John J. Williams, R-Del., to have the committee review old investigations into the 1946 purchase of the St. Johns River Shipyard at Jacksonville, Fla., by the Tampa Shipbuilding Co., controlled by Industrialist Louis Wolfson.

Williams said the investigations showed McCloskey pulled strings with the Maritime Commission to permit the Wolfson company to change its bid from an installment to a cash basis to win the award of the contract in January 1946.

Williams also charged that a Wolfson employe had made a payment of \$25,000 to David R. Knapp, a Maritime Commission employe, prior to the transaction.

Sen. John Sparkman, D-Ala., acting chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, read a letter from McCloskey denying any participation in the Wolfson contract and any knowledge of the payment.

Couple Sent To Hospital

PORTLAND (AP)—Federal Judge Gus J. Solomon sentenced a Portland man and wife to prison terms Wednesday, then ordered them to the U.S. Public Health Service Hospital for treatment.

Both are addicted to narcotics, he said.

Solomon sentenced William H. MacGowan, 33, to 20 years in prison for violation of narcotics laws and gave Mrs. MacGowan a five-year term for forgery.

He added that MacGowan's sentence can be reduced if reports are favorable during a 90-day observation period while he is in custody.

The federal hospital is at Lexington, Ky.

MIAMI BEACH—A dreamy-eyed Hawaiian beauty on her first visit to the mainland reigns Friday as Miss U.S.A.

Macel Leilani Wilson of Honolulu, chosen the fairest in the land Thursday night from among the queens of 40 states, competes Friday night and Saturday for the Miss Universe title. Also seeking the honor are delegates from 50 nations.

Joyce Collin, Lebanon, Ore., was one of 15 finalists who competed Thursday night.

"I needed the money to go to school," said sweet Leilani. She plans to attend San Francisco City College.

But school may have to wait until she completes a \$5,000 contract she will receive for public appearances. Her crown also entitles her to \$1,000 cash.

Her father, Harry Wilson Jr.,

is a plumber. He and Mrs. Wilson recently moved from Honolulu to San Francisco. He is Hawaiian, Chinese and English; Mrs. Wilson is Portuguese.

Macel has dark brown hair and eyes, is 5 feet, 6 1/2 inches tall and weighs 120. She said she measured 35-24-35 when she left home, but now is 36-23 1/2-35 1/2.

Ribicoff Shrugs Off Opponent's Charges

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—Abraham A. Ribicoff, the first member of President Kennedy's Cabinet to resign, heads for the Connecticut Democratic state convention Friday night to fight for the nomination for U. S. senator.

With the backing of Democratic National Chairman John Bailey and other party leaders, Ribicoff is expected to get the nomination without trouble.

"I like the challenge of elective office," Ribicoff said Thursday night in a television speech announcing his resignation as secretary of health, education and welfare.

Challenge is what he promptly got from his opponent for the nomination, Congressman-at-large Frank Kowalski.

Kowalski issued a statement claiming he had been offered U. S. Sen. Thomas Dodd's job if he would consent to run again for Congress this year and leave the field clear for Ribicoff.

Dodd's current term ends in 1964. Ribicoff and Bailey, both targets to Kowalski's frequent

charges of bossism, pooh-poohed his accusation.

"Desperation tactics," said Ribicoff. "Tom Dodd is a great senator and close friend."

"I am for Dodd," said Bailey, "and I will say so when I introduce him at the convention."

The convention opens Friday night with Sen. Mike Mansfield, D-Mont., Senate majority leader, scheduled to deliver the keynote address. The business of choosing candidates will begin Saturday.

Ribicoff said one of his principal motives in seeking a seat in the Senate was to be able to vote in support of the programs he championed while a Cabinet member.

In Washington, the White House made public Ribicoff's letter of resignation and a reply from the President in which Kennedy also declared "We need your voice and vote in the halls of Congress."

Kennedy told Ribicoff action must now be taken in Congress to carry out the programs both have supported and that even one vote may spell success or failure.

The President said he accepted Ribicoff's request to resign in order to run for the Senate where "you can next year cast that vote."

The choice of a successor is expected soon. Kennedy has known for months Ribicoff planned to run for the Senate and may have made his choice some time ago.

Mentioned for the post are former Gov. Leroy Collins of Florida, president of the National Association of Broadcasters; Rep. Edith Green, D-Ore.; Veterans Administrator John S. Gleason Jr., and Robert Weaver, head of the Housing and Home Finance Agency.

Although Ribicoff is expected to win the nomination for sen-

ator, the question is whether he can prevent Kowalski from garnering 20 per cent of the convention delegates' votes—enough to force a statewide primary later.

The Republican candidate for senator is Rep. Horace Seely-Brown Jr., who scored a victory of surprising proportions over former Gov. John Lodge at the GOP convention a month ago.
