

Union Orders Suspension Of Secretary

Ouster Prompted By Senate Probe

NEW YORK (AP) — The American Guild of Variety Artists has suspended Jackie Bright with-out pay from his \$31,200-a-year job as executive secretary until he clears himself of "all allegations and accusations" stem-ming from the Senate B-girl in-vestigation.

The suspension was an-nounced in a statement issued Thursday after a meeting of the national board of the AFL-CIO union.

At Senate investigation sub-committee hearings in Wash-ington last month, Bright was ac-cused of accepting bribes and il-legal payoffs from various sources in the entertainment field.

Testifying before the com-mittee Bright denied the charges and accepted the subcommit-tee's invitation to submit to a lie detector test along with some witnesses who made the accusations.

Bright told the subcommittee his union had been "vilified by a conglomeration of erroneous statements and deliberate lies blown up beyond all normal proportions."

Bright is in a hospital follow-ing a heart attack, and the union's national board took this into consideration in its suspen-sion order.

The union statement said in part: "During and because of his illness, we extend to him five weeks sick pay. Should he be completely vindicated to the satisfaction of the national board, he shall be reinstated and shall receive retroactive pay."

At the opening of the Sen-ate hearings, actress Penny Singleton charged that under Bright's administration the union opened its doors to strip teasers and exotic dancers who spent most of their time work-ing as bar girls.

The subcommittee heard testi-mony that the union took no action while racketeering night club operators preyed on female members, forcing them to per-form immoral dances, hustle customers for drinks and en-gage in prostitution.

Two More Countries Purchase U.N. Bonds

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP) — Jordan and South Viet Nam have bought some of the project-ed \$200 million worth of emer-gency United Nations bonds, it was announced Thursday.

Jordan purchased \$25,000 worth and South Viet Nam, which is not a member of the world organization, \$10,000 the announcement said.

Against Saskatchewan College

Harassment Charge Levelled

REGINA, Sask. (AP) — Premier Woodrow Lloyd says the Saskat-chewan College of Surgeons and Physicians is using its policing powers to harass doctors who refused to join the strike against the provincial government's so-cialist medical scheme.

A one-man commission is being set up to investigate com-plaints, especially those against doctors recruited to fill gaps in medical service since a doctors' strike began July 1.

Premier Lloyd said Thursday evidence has accumulated that the college, responsible for li-censing doctors in the province, seeks to use its powers as "an offensive weapon against doc-tors who are not supporting the college's walkout."

Jet Pilot Bails Out Of Disabled Craft

MONTESSANO (AP) — An F102 jet fighter plane crashed in a timbered area about 30 miles north of here Thursday, but the pilot bailed out safely and was picked up about 30 minutes af-ter the crash.

The pilot was identified as Capt. James F. Jasper, 32, whose home town is Benton Harbor, Mich. Jasper is a flight instructor at Paine Air Force Base, where his plane was based.

The college said the charges are "completely without founda-tion."

Under the provincial medical professions act, the college said, it is empowered to investigate any charges against doctors and it is the duty of the college registrar to do so.

The college said it had no part in recent dismissals from two hospitals of doctors who had been recruited from Britain. It said they were recalled at the request of the local hos-pital boards.

Since the withdrawal of ser-vices in protest against the gov-ernment's compulsory, tax-pre-paid medical care plan, about 200 doctors have been providing

emergency service at 40 desig-nated hospitals. About 500 doc-tors are on strike.

The college provides the emer-gency service, coordinated by the Canadian Medical Assn.

More doctors from Britain, re-cruited by the medical care in-surance plan, were expected Fri-day. A group that arrived Tues-day began registering Thursday for practice here.
