

European-Made Drug Cited First Steps Taken to Free 5 Americans

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP)—A pretty young woman who knows that she may give birth to a deformed baby must wait still longer for a legal decision on her plea for an abortion.

Mrs. Robert L. Finkbine is asking the court to permit aborting her two and one-half-month pregnancy.

The 30-year-old star of a Phoenix kiddies television program says she has taken Thalidomide, a European-made drug blamed for births of deformed babies. The drug is a tranquilizing agent.

On Friday, the state attorney general and the county attorney asked to be dismissed as co-defendants in the action.

Superior Court Judge Yale McFate said he would have to study the matter until at least Monday before ruling on the motions. A speedy hearing was requested because of Mrs. Finkbine's condition.

Finkbine, 31-year-old high school history teacher and assistant football coach, sat quietly at the back of the small courtroom Friday. The room was filled with newsmen and photographers.

Mrs. Finkbine remained in seclusion under her doctor's orders.

The Finkbines and Good Samaritan Hospital are co-complainants in the suit. Arizona law states that abortion is permissible only when a prospective mother's life is in danger.

The hour-and-a-quarter hearing was devoted to argument on the motions for dismissal.

Attorney Howard Leibow, representing the Finkbines, accused the defendants of trying to "beg off."

Walter Cheifetz, attorney for the hospital, cited reports in the press that he interpreted as threats by the county attorney to prosecute if the Finkbines go ahead with the abortion.

Cheifetz and Leibow both rejected a suggestion by the defendants that the Finkbines should take action against the hospital to obtain a court ruling.

If the judge rules for dismissal, the Finkbines would be left without a case. The couple and the hospital would have to reconsider their position and seek another solution.

Kennedys Get Together For First Lady's Birthday

HYANNIS PORT, Mass. (AP)—A flock of Kennedys got together Saturday for a birthday celebration—the 33rd for First Lady Jacqueline.

The family made arrangements for a party Saturday night after taking it easy Friday—aboard boat and water skis—at this scene of many Kennedy reunions.

President Kennedy arrived Friday evening to join in the festivities and to be first to wish his wife "happy birthday."

In keeping with their custom since entering the White House, the Kennedys declared the occasion purely personal and made public none of their plans.

The President wasn't saying what he gave his wife for a present. Neither were daughter Caroline nor son John Jr.

There was no secret, however, about the birthday dinner. Only the grownups among the many here for the weekend will be present. The children will sing their birthday song earlier.

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Spalding, old friends of the Kennedys, also were on hand for the anniversary with their two daughters. Spalding is a New York investment banker.

The clan will gather at the Squaw Island home of singer Morton Downey, who turned it over to the First Family for the month. Mrs. Kennedy and the youngsters have been here all along, and the President has flown up for weekends.

This summer and last have given Mrs. Kennedy an opportunity to be with her children in the vacation atmosphere of Cape Cod, removed from the duties of First Lady.

But the fat man was trapped by himself. As perhaps the fastest ad-libber in nightclub comedy, his genius has been the ability to deflate people of authority. But he was boss this week, so who was there to deflate except his guests? The result was comical discomfort on his part as he vainly tried to restrain himself from bombarding them—as a decent host would. Happily, he did not always succeed.

Being a man who sees things clear through, Leonard certainly had sense enough not to imagine himself as a new late-night idol. He was merely doing the obvious—getting tremendous television exposure to build his name and thereby his price for public appearances.

Unfortunately, he had the tendency to introduce his acts as wonderful and great and good friends, and so forth—which seemed out of character for comedy's angry man. One of his great friends was a comedian named Georgie Kaye, who could use a lesson in timing but had a funny sequence about the President and the American Medical Assn. He said the President appointed a chiropractor as surgeon-general, and the AMA retaliated by forbidding any patient to reach the age of 65. He said this was "preventive medicine."

Souphanouvong Orders Action

VIENTIANE, Laos (AP)—Acting Premier Prince Souphanouvong said Saturday he has taken the first steps to release five Americans held prisoner by his pro-Communist Pathet Lao troops.

Souphanouvong said he ordered his troops to move the Americans to areas near air strips in anticipation of their release. He said he expected to have "precise information next week" on when the prisoners would be freed.

The U.S. Embassy has said the Americans known to be captive of the Pathet Lao are: Grant Wolfkill, a National Broadcasting Co. cameraman from Shelton, Wash.; John Morrow, of Galloway, Tenn.; and John Shore Jr., of Brooklyn, N. Y., civilian airman with the charter firm Air America; Sgt. Orville Ballenger, Columbus, Ohio; and Maj. Lawrence Bailey, Laurel, Md.

Souphanouvong spoke to newsmen after his return from his former rebel headquarters at Khang Khay and a meeting with U.S. Ambassador Leonard Unger. Unger had called on Souphanouvong to inquire about what had been done about freeing the prisoners as called for in the Geneva agreement that guarantees Laos' neutrality.

Resistance Fighter Gets Life in Prison

WARSAW, Poland (AP)—A World War II resistance fighter who hid out in a war-bunker and turned armed robber was sentenced to life in prison Friday, press reports said.

Andrzej Kiszka was convicted of murder and robbery. But the court declined to order the death penalty asked by the prosecution because of Kiszka's resistance role and aid in helping Jews escape persecution, the newspaper Kurier Polski said.
