

## Pleasant Hill Woman Dies

A native of the Emerald Empire, Olive Ann Cornelius, 73, died Monday at a Salem hospital. Funeral arrangements are pending at Buell Chapel, Springfield.

Miss Cornelius was born at Walton on April 26, 1889. When a small child, her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Cornelius, moved to the Pleasant Hill area, where Miss Cornelius attended Trent and Pleasant Hill schools.

She was a student at Eugene Bible University from 1917 to 1925.

Miss Cornelius, who had been ill for the past year, was a great-granddaughter of Lane County pioneer Elijah Bristow. She was a long-time member of Pleasant Hill Church of Christ.

Survivors include two brothers, Millard and Archie Cornelius, both of Springfield, a sister, Mrs. Grant Lattin of Pleasant Hill, and several nephews. A third brother, Jesse Cornelius, preceded her in death.

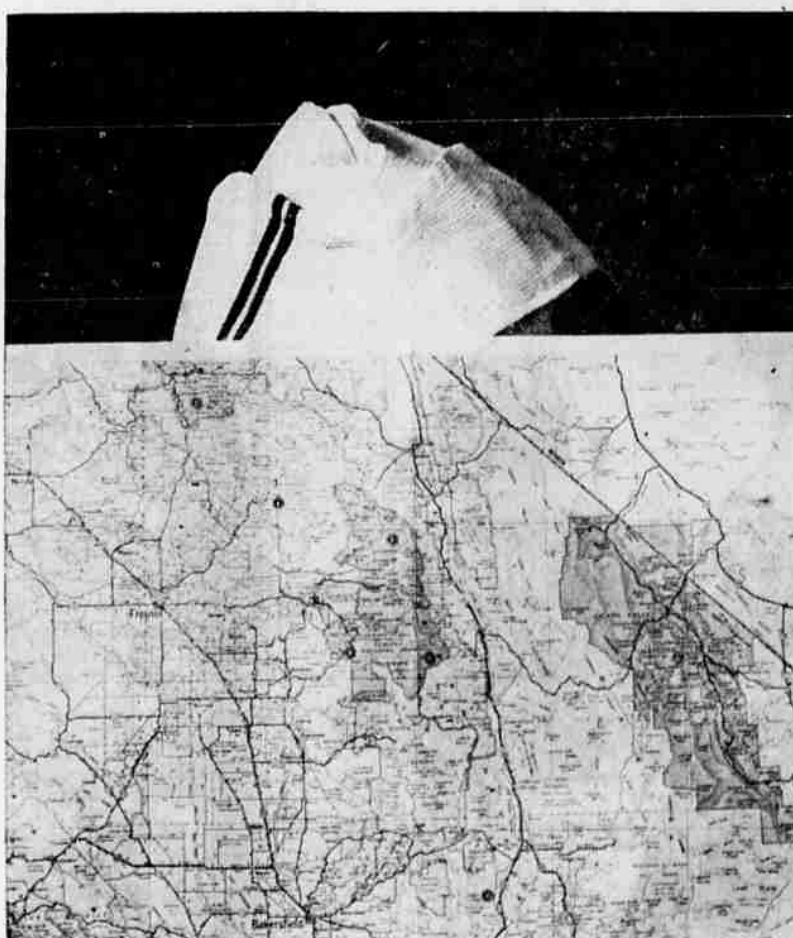

The new and expanded industries include Hercules Powder, Portland; Weyerhaeuser Timber Co., North Bend; and West Coast Plywood, Grants Pass.

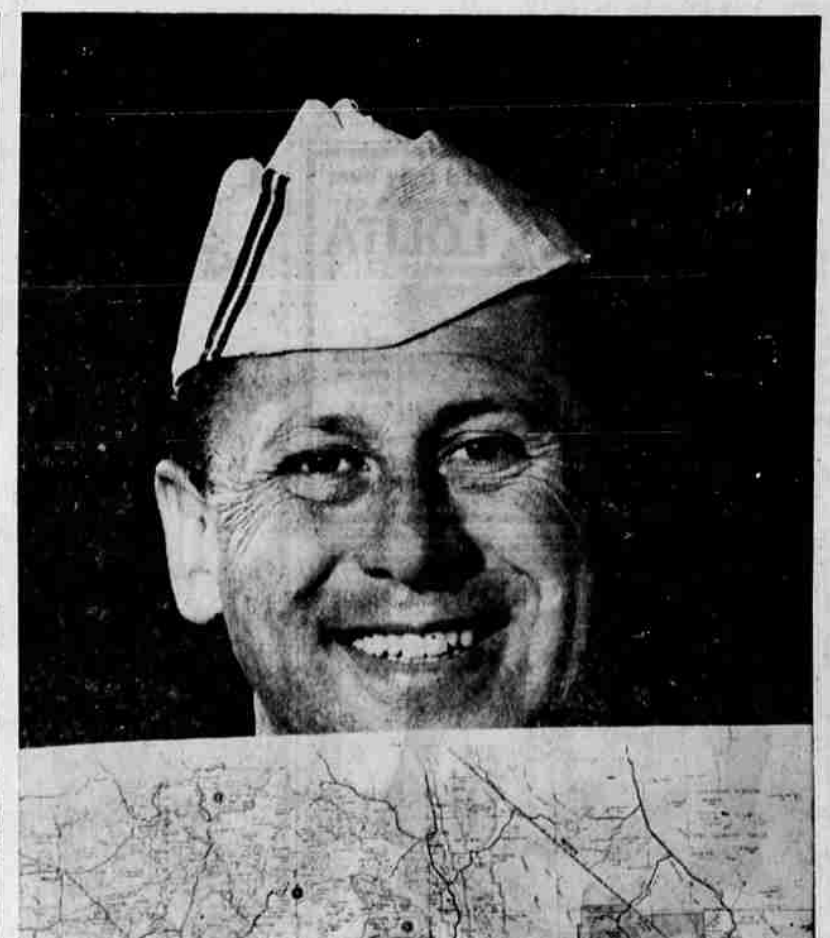
