

IAC Breaks Four World Swim Marks

CUYAHOGA FALLS, Ohio (AP) — The Indianapolis Athletic Club (IAC) today rules as the New York Yankees of the swim world on the strength of its unbelievable performance in the man's national AAU outdoor swimming championships.

Tom Stock, Ted Stickle and the IAC's "B" 400-medley relay team broke four of the six world records that fell by the wayside during the three day event.

Stock set a new 200-meter backstroke mark of 2:10.9 Friday, then came back Saturday to register a new standard of 1:01.0 for the 100-meter Saturday.

Sunday he, Chet Jastremski, Fred Schmidt and Pete Simz combined their efforts to breeze to a new 400-medley relay record of 4:01.6, clipping 1.4 seconds off the old mark set by an IAC squad a year ago.

Stickle, who set a world record of 4:55.6 in the 400-meter individual medley Saturday, became a double winner by winning the 200-meter medley in 2:15.2 Sunday. This was three-tenths of a second below his American record.

The IAC wound up with 124 points, compared with 35½ for runnerup Santa Clara.

Carl Robie, a 17-year-old high school student from Philadelphia, duplicated Stock's feat of breaking two world records. His efforts came in the 200-meter butterfly. In the finals Robie raced home in 2:10.8 and in the preliminaries he cracked the mark with a 2:12.4 effort. Robie set the previous world mark of 2:12.6 at Los Angeles in 1961.

Volanski Sets Wins, Sets Track Mark

Arlin Volanski of Auburn, Wash., walked off with the big money Sunday in the second annual West Coast Stock Hard-top championships at the Eugene Speedway.

Volanski won both 40-lap main events in the two-day program and also set a new track record for hard-tops with a time of 21.91 for a lap in the time trials.

Joe Anderson of Woodburn won the 25-lap B main both Saturday night and Sunday.

Palmer Wins Again

AKRON, Ohio (AP) — Arnold Palmer, the great one, came to the American Golf Classic with two goals in mind and achieved them both.

First, Palmer wanted to master the treacherous 7,165-yard Firestone layout with its monstrous No. 16 hole, which measures 625 yards. Then he wanted to win enough money to surpass his own earnings record, established in 1960.

The Pennsylvania pouter, whose galleries resemble Genghis Khan's hordes, put together four magnificent rounds of 67, 69-70-70 for a 276 total, four strokes under Firestone's par 35-35, 70, to win top money of \$9,000.

He finished five strokes ahead of the field surpassing the mark of \$75,262 he established two years ago. It was his eighth tournament triumph this year. Palmer, 32, now has a career total of 36 victories.

No. 16, which cost Palmer the PGA victory in 1960, was humbled this time. In each and every round, Palmer scored a birdie.

"I played it differently this time," said Palmer. "But despite four birdies, I still have a lot of respect for that monster."

"It was the best putting I've ever had," Palmer said. "I know I've played better golf, but I'm
