IDANHA — State police game officers Sunday arrested a lumber mill manager on a charge of permitting waste to flow into the Santiam River.

Television in Review

Networks Cover Russ Spacemen

NEW YORK—"This new feat is so great that there's no use talking about records — all of them have been broken."

That was the voice of Russell Jones, NBC correspondent in Moscow, coming to us from that city as part of a television special whipped up in a hurry by the network for the half-hour "This is NBC News," a regular Sunday program.

The subject, of course, was the Russian achievement of a space cube built for two. All three American networks had shown during the day the historic first television pictures originating and sent down from space—of cosmonaut Andrian Nikolayev in his orbiting Vostok III, fiddling with some gear that appeared to be floating in mid-capsule in front of his face.

These moving pictures went from the satellite to Moscow, which fed them onto the Eurovision network. They were picked from the Eurovision screens in London by videotape and kinescope and flown to New York.

And let it be said right here that as the jet planes get faster, and faster, the need of American television networks for satellite transmission as Telestar provides is lessened. The French expect to have a jet by 1968 that will cross the Atlantic in two hours.

One of a panel of NBC newsmen in Washington asked Jones about a rumor that the television pictures might have been made

beforehand and then broadcast to Russian home screens after the vehicle was orbited.

"I don't think they could be that bad if they were made beforehand," Jones replied, and if you saw them you know what he meant. But they certainly were impressive with what Merrill Mueller called "an eerie weightlessness."

By the time of the late night newscasts we had movies of Pavel Popovich, the second cosmonaut, in his craft.

ABC put on its space special late Sunday night, narrated by its science editor, Jules Bergman, and featuring an interview with C. Stark Draper of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Draper heads an MIT group developing a guidance system for the Apollo lunar project. He said the Russian guidance capability for what they're doing now is "obviously excellent."

I thought NBC furnished us with a beautiful program in "It Happened To Me" Sunday, a documentary which the British Broadcasting Corp. made in Cork, Ireland, of the late Father O'Flynn's work in helping children with speech defects.

On "Wide World of Sports" the ABC cameras did a fine hour and one-half job on the men's National AAU swimming and diving championships at Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, and Philadelphia. The underwater shots of races underway were adept and informative. With our wealth of teenage talent in the world-record class, we should make quite an Olympic Games showing in 1964.

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Italy Auto King Takes Jackie Sailing

RAVELLO, Italy (U) — Gianni Agnelli, Italy's auto king, took America's First Lady on a cruise on the blue waters of the Gulf of Salerno Monday.

Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy, on a two-week vacation in this southern Italian resort area of mountains and beaches, kicked off her sandals as soon as she boarded Agnelli's sleek 82-foot ocean-going yacht, the Agneta. The President's wife was wearing white slacks and a violet blouse.

The Agneta is a two-masted vessel with both sail and motor power, and Agnelli said he planned to use both. He said he expected to cruise to last "until late." It started relatively late in the day, too—after noon.

That was because Mrs. Kennedy, Agnelli and Prince Stanislaus Radziwill, Mrs. Kennedy's brother-in-law, were up late Sunday night. They paid a post-midnight visit to a sidewalk cafe in Ravello's main square and drank Gran Caruso red wine and coffee until almost 1:30 a.m.

Agnelli, whose family owns the giant Fiat auto works, and his wife spent most of Sunday with Mrs. Kennedy.

Four-year-old Caroline Kennedy was up early and at the beach and did not go on the yacht trip.

Portland Man Held in Shooting Of Policeman

PORTLAND (U) — A shooting Sunday night resulted in a policeman being wounded and a northeast Portland resident being taken into custody.

Arthur N. Baty, 51, was charged with assault with a deadly weapon with bail set at \$10,000 in connection with the shooting spree. One of the bullets struck Patrolman Albert L. Wilhelm in the right shoulder.

Police said the shots were apparently fired from a bedroom window of the Baty home with a .32 caliber pistol.

Officers said the bullets struck some houses two blocks away. Police said 22 expended shells were found in the second floor bedroom of the Baty home, on the ground and on the roof below the window.

Wilhelm said he was called to the scene about 11:30 p.m. (PDT). Wilhelm said he went to a back yard near the Baty home and was talking to a resident when lights started going on and off inside.

He said a shot went over his head. "I dropped to one knee and the second shot hit me in the arm," he said. Wilhelm said he fell flat and there was silence for a few moments before the shooting was resumed.

Baty told police he thought he heard prowlers and fired at what he "thought was a sound."
