

Evangelist Tells Of 'Amazing Things'

Vaughn Hayden of Eugene is a man who believes in miracles—miracles of healing accomplished through prayer and the power of God.

And Hayden, who returned to Eugene last week from two months in Mexico, has many experiences to tell about from the program he organized for evangelism south of the border, "Mission to Mexico."

He tells of "the most amazing things" when referring to occurrences at the evangelistic meetings.

10 Healed
"We had . . . probably ten (persons) who were nearly deaf whose ears were healed—instantly, right before the people," he said in an interview.

"It amazed us as well as the people."
The "us" Hayden referred to were the young people who accompanied him on the program, which was supported by a number of individuals and several congregations in the Emerald Empire.

Three of the team members, Joann Shouse, Janice Simmons and Kay Stanton, are still in Mexico, he said. They are expected to return to the United States late in August.

'Tremendous Success'
Hayden's team of young men set up a schedule of meetings in northern Mexico.

"We had tremendous success," Hayden reports. "The Pentecostal church in Mexico is quite strong and growing rapidly."

Hayden, a Pentecostal, believes in faith healing and "speaking in tongues." He makes these claims for the "Mission in Mexico" program:

• A little girl "totally blind in one eye. We tested it (the eye) quite thoroughly before praying for her and just after prayer she could see perfectly."

• A small girl was confined to her home "and we weren't able to see her. So we prayed over a piece of paper and sent it home to her. When they put it on her body she was instantly healed."

One of the girl's disabilities, Hayden said, was a paralyzed mouth. "She could speak after prayer."

• A 75-year-old woman could hear only shouts. "She was prayed for and could instantly hear a whisper from 20 feet away." The next day, Hayden said, the woman "went all over town telling everyone."

"There were many of these," he said, and "they're documented."

Now, Hayden has some plans. **Mexico, Then Haiti**

He's going to continue "Mission to Mexico." In December he and his wife will return to Mexico and go on to Haiti for evangelistic work.

"We want to sponsor a missionary-evangelist in every country of the western hemisphere by the end of 1963," Hayden said.

To a great extent, he said, these missionary-evangelists would be nationals of the country they serve.

Soon Hayden will publish a missionary magazine to support his work. The magazine, to be titled "Missionary Revolution," would have a circulation, Hayden said, of 1,000 copies per month. Its mailing address will be the same as "Mission to Mexico," P.O. Box 228, Eugene.

"Our program," Hayden said, "will be paid by faith."

Unity Church To Hear Talk By Minister
