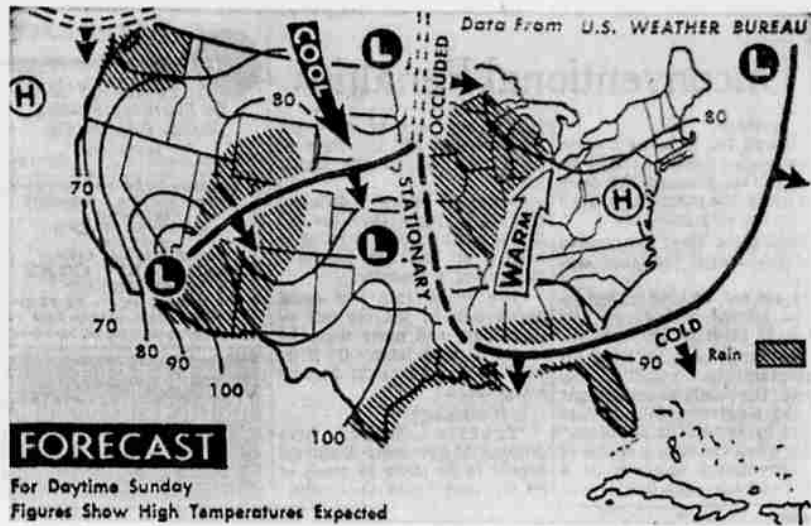




Partly Cloudy

Candidates Set Appearances

Fairs are not only for get-togethers, but also provide political candidates a chance to meet a lot of people.

At the county fair this week both the Democrats and Republicans have set up booths and are proclaiming certain days for their candidates.

For instance, Wednesday is "Re-elect Senator Morse" day. The Democrats plan to follow up with a Friday appearance of Robert Duncan, Fourth District congressional candidate, and gubernatorial hopeful Robert Thornton on Saturday.

A. W. Lafferty of Portland has called for a convention of electors Tuesday at Portland's Pythian Hall in hopes of being nominated as an independent candidate for the Senate.

Lafferty, who is in his 80s, served in Congress from 1913 to 1915.

Lafferty said he is hopeful of being nominated, but noted that the convention "could take the bull by the horns, and draft someone else."

Eugene and Springfield Kiwanis clubs will hold joint meetings twice in September to hear Oregon's senatorial candidates. Republican Sig Underwood will speak Sept. 5, Senator Morse, Sept. 19. Both noon meetings

will be held in the Eugene Hotel.

Underwood will speak at the Benton County Republican picnic Monday in Corvallis and has announced that Harold Livingston of Oregon State University will serve as his area coordinator for the remainder of the campaign.

Livingston, running for political office for the first time in the May primary, was defeated by Underwood in the GOP race.

Both Carl Fisher, Republican aspirant for the House from Oregon's Fourth District, and Robert Duncan have stepped up their personal appearances as the Nov. 6 general election draws nearer.

Both men have almost daily personal appearances slated for the remaining 12 weeks.

Jo Kittredge, Republican candidate for the State Senate, has a full week of appearances lined up including five days at the Lane County Fair in both the Republican Women's booth and the Eugene Business and Professional Women's stand.

Mrs. Kittredge will attend the Elks picnic today and a coffee hour Monday at 9:30 a.m. standard, 10:30 daylight. The coffee hour will be at the home of

She will attend a Quota Club potluck supper Monday at 6 p.m. standard, 7 daylight and on Tuesday she will be the guest of Mrs. Max Burris, 1204 Oak Dr., Eugene, at 7 p.m. standard, 8 daylight.

'Wrong Airport' Pilot Suspended

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The pilot and co-pilot of a jet airliner which landed by mistake at the small Troutdale, Ore., airport last Sunday have been suspended, the Federal Aviation Agency said Friday.

The big United Airlines DC-8, carrying 88 persons, was supposed to land at the Portland International Airport some nine miles to the west. No one was hurt.

Troutdale's single runway of 4,600 feet is about half the length of the Portland airport runways.

The FAA said the suspension of the pilot, Capt. S. R. Whipple, became effective for 30 days at the time he landed the plane at Troutdale.

First Officer J. M. Lezark was suspended for 14 days, also effective from the time of the landing.
