

3rd Minister in Family

Ordination, Then Mission in Africa

Donald H. Maier of Eugene will become the third member of his family to serve the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, in Africa this fall.

Maier, the son of the Rev. and Mrs. W. B. Maier, former Eugene residents now on missionary services in Nigeria, will be ordained and commissioned as a missionary Sunday at services at Grace Lutheran Church, Eugene.

His father, former pastor of Grace Lutheran, is teaching at the Lutheran seminary at Obot Idim in eastern Nigeria. His brother, Dr. William J. Maier, is a medical missionary in Nigeria, serving there since 1958.

The ordination-commission-

ing service will begin at 10 a.m. standard, 11 daylight. The public is welcome.

Maier graduated on May 30 from Concordia Theological Seminary in St. Louis, Mo., following eight years of theological and pre-theological training.

A 1954 graduate of Eugene High School, Maier graduated from Concordia Junior College in Portland in 1956. He received a bachelor of arts degree from Concordia Seminary in 1958, and a bachelor of divinity degree in May.

As a part of his training, he spent two years of theological internship in central Florida, ministering to congregations in Bartow and

Plant City.

He will become a missionary to Ghana in west Africa. He will serve under the auspices of the Lutheran Synodical Conference, a mission board of the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, and two other Lutheran synods in west Africa.

Maier, his wife Sylvia and their two children, Deborah, 2, and Donald, 11 months, will be living in Tema, a new port city about 20 miles from Accra, the seacoast capital of Ghana.

Because Lutheran missionary work in the new nation began just three years ago, Maier will be working with only one other Lutheran Mis-

sionary.

Sunday's ordination-commissioning service will be a family affair for the ministerial candidate. His uncle, the Rev. James P. Maier of Sweet Home, will read the rite of ordination. The Rev. L. C. Warneke, Torrance, Calif., brother of Mrs. Maier, will be guest preacher at the ordination service.

The candidate will be speaker at the church Sunday at 7:30 a.m. standard, 8:30 daylight.

The newest Maier missionary family will leave Oregon by air Sept. 22. En route to Ghana, they plan to spend some time visiting Maier's parents in Nigeria.

NCC Grad to Be Ordained

Ronald E. Coulter of Eugene, a graduate of Northwest Christian College and the University of Oregon, will be ordained Sunday night into the ministry of the Christian Church.

The ordination will be held at 6:30 p.m. standard, 7:30 p.m. daylight, at First Christian Church, Eugene. The public is welcome.

Coulter, who is known in the Eugene area as drama coach for NCC and director of a number of Christian Drama Troupe productions, plans to utilize religious drama as well as preaching in his ministry.

Participants in the service will include the Rev. Carlton C. Buck, pastor of First Christian Church, Eugene; the Rev. Guy Aydelott, formerly of Eugene and now associate minister at Kern Park Christian Church, Portland; Noel Campbell, elder of Winston Christian Church, Winston; David Farr, a student at NCC; Ross J. Griffith, president of NCC, and the Rev. Harold Lyman, minister of Court Street Christian Church, Salem, and chairman for the Oregon Commission on the Ministry.

Others will include R. C. Royston, chairman of First Christian's board of elders; the Rev. Wendell Wagler, associate minister at First Christian Church,

Medford, and Coulter's brother, Maud Skaggs Woodard, professor emeritus of music at NCC.

Farr will be organist for the program and the Rev. Aydelott will sing two solos.

Mrs. Woodard will read an "ordination charge for personal growth," especially written for Coulter's ordination by a long-time family friend, the Rev. Mary Welch of Henderson, Texas. The Rev. Welch is a Methodist minister who has written several books and a number of selections of religious poetry.

Evangelist White has had twelve years experience in the work of general evangelism. For five years he served as state evangelist of the men's organization of the Churches of Christ and Christian Churches of Oregon, during which time he established several congregations throughout the state. He was instrumental in instituting the Northwest Direct-Support Missionary Conference, and formerly directed the Wi-Ne-Ma Week of Mission. He has served on the board of directors of San Jose Bible College in San Jose, Calif.

White is the author of "The Greatest Work in the World," "52 Soul-Winning Sermon Outlines," "Sabbath or Lord's Day — Which?" workbooks on "Becoming a Christian," and "Growing as a Christian," and other materials in the program of "Comprehensive Evangelism."
