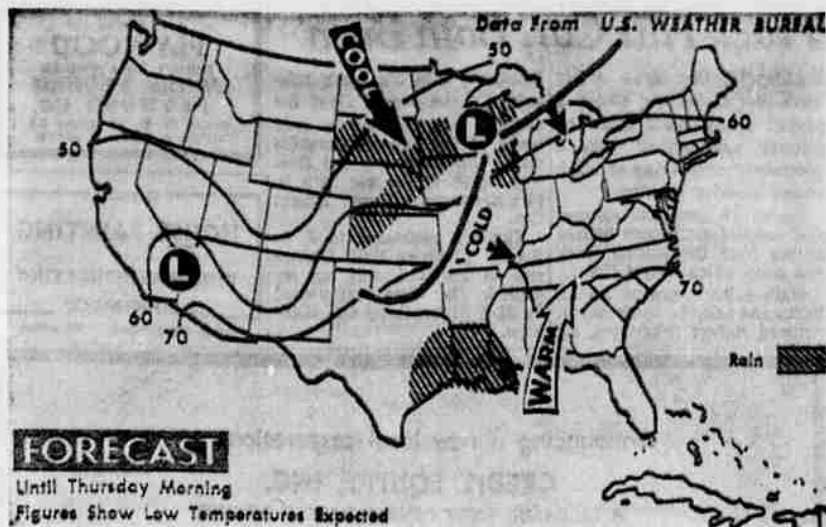




Fair Skies

Western Oregon and the western half of the nation is expected to escape precipitation tonight. Scattered showers are predicted for the northern and Central Plains, western Great Lakes region and western Gulf coast. Cooler temperatures are expected over the northern and central Plains and warmer temperatures are forecast for the Ohio valley. Tropical storm Alma, no longer a hurricane, has decreased in strength and is no longer a major threat, weathermen said.

Alice Lee Murder Mystery Unsolved After Two Years

The Alice Lee murder case is two years old today. It was on Aug. 29, 1960, that the blond, 7-year-old youngster was abducted from a bean yard near Trent, southeast of Eugene, and killed.

The fate of the small girl was unknown for 18 days despite numerous searches of the fields and brushy areas surrounding the bean field from where she disappeared.

Her body finally was found in a shallow grave in a wooded area. Her jacket was knotted tightly around her neck.

Identity of her murderer still isn't known.

Law enforcement agencies, however, have not closed the file on the case. State Police Sgt. Robert Baker and Lane County Sheriff Harry Marlowe each say their offices have checked between 10 and 15 suspects or leads during the past year, adding still further to the voluminous files on the murder.

Both agreed, however, that they are no closer to a solution now than they were a year ago. The main theory still held by police agencies is that the murderer was someone known and trusted by Alice Lee.

Retired Banker Dies

PORTLAND — Frederick Greenwood, 73, retired banker and former president of the Oregon Bankers Assn. died Tuesday after a brief illness.

Survivors include his widow and a son, Robert E. Greenwood, a student at the University of Oregon.

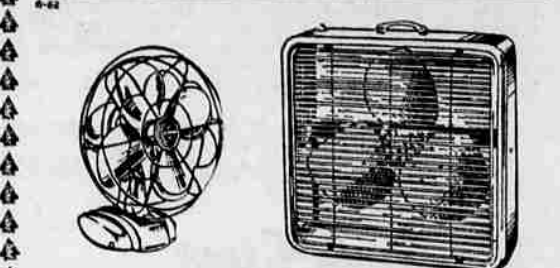
