

As Catholic Inquiry Forum Director Layman Serves Two Parishes

Just over a year ago, Richard Fitzgerald gave up a promising career in industrial sales, borrowed money and headed back to school for a year.

And he knew that when he finished school, he would be taking on an arduous career that required more than a 40-hour week, a career that required continuous study.

Fitzgerald's destiny was set when he read in a national magazine of a new program for Roman Catholic laymen, the Institute of Lay Theology at the University of San Francisco.

He—and 600 others—applied for the school. After extensive tests and interviews, Fitzgerald was one of the 15 selected for the Institute's second year-long program.

Now, after a year's study emphasizing theology he has arrived in the Eugene-Springfield area to serve as an inquiry forum director, dividing his time between St. Peter's parish in Eugene and the St. Alice parish in Springfield.

He is now holding his first lecture series on Catholic theology and practices and is making plans for future programs.

Fitzgerald defines his purpose as a full-time church lay worker as including three concepts:

- To provide an explanation of Catholic beliefs and practices for those not of the Catholic faith.
- To give Catholics an opportunity to know more about their faith.
- To promote better understanding between Catholics and their neighbors.

His lectures, designed for Catholics, non-Catholics interested in the church and for those non-Catholics who are simply curious about the church, include such programs as an evening of showing slides of the Mass, explaining the service; "basic" theological discussions on a number of topics, and a tour of a Catholic church.

Then there is the important task of answering questions. "My work," Fitzgerald emphasized, "is to complement that of the priests, who just don't have time for this."

He pointed out that the St. Alice parish has about 600 families, and St. Peter about 400.

Fitzgerald, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, said that during his years at John Carroll University in Cleveland he considered entering the priesthood. He didn't.

But he considers his work now "as a career." He is expected to continue serious study in his religion, attend meetings with the other inquiry participants and work with the members of his parishes in formulating programs.

Grace Baptist Congregation Plans Move

Grace Missionary Baptist Church, a new congregation in Eugene affiliated with the American Baptist Assn. on a national level, will move into new quarters this Sunday.

The congregation has purchased a church building at 4020 Marshall St., Eugene, for \$5,000.

This is the former church of the Eugene Missionary Baptist Church, an independent congregation that is not affiliated with any larger group. A spokesman for the latter congregation said that re-location plans for the Eugene-Springfield area will be announced in the near future.

The building, originally a dwelling, has been used as a church for a number of years, and remodeled for that purpose several times.

At present, the building has an auditorium seating approximately 100 persons, five classrooms and a kitchen.

The Grace congregation plans to hold its first services in the new building Sunday. Sunday school will be at 9:45 a.m. standard, 10:45 daylight, and morning preaching at 11 a.m. standard, noon daylight. Evening preaching will be at 6 p.m. standard, 7 daylight.

Current plans for the building, a member of the Grace congregation said, include the addition of a church steeple, painting and some remodeling.

Pastor of Grace Missionary Baptist is J. W. "Bill" Dotson, 2865 Hilyard St., Eugene.

Bible Classes to Be Offered For Students in 20 City Schools

Released time Bible classes for youngsters in the third through fifth grades will be held this coming school year for students in Eugene schools.

Classes will be resumed, after a one-year lapse, at Meadow Lark School, and classes will also be held for students at Ellis Parker School.

In addition, students at the following Eugene elementary schools will be eligible for the classes: Santa Clara, River Road, Bailey Hill, Ida Patterson, Laurel Hill, Silver Lea, Edison, Lincoln, Adams, Dunn, Howard, Frances Willard, Stella Magladry, Willagillespie, Willakenzie, Westmoreland and Twin Oaks.

Permission Needed

The classes, interdenominational in subject matter, are open to all students in the three grades with written permission of parents. The program is sponsored by the Eugene Council of Christian Education and is financed by contributions from church congregations, individuals and church groups.

This will be the 39th year of the released-time program in Eugene. The classes, held under a state law that permits students to leave school buildings during school hours for religious instruction, are not held in school buildings or on school property.

Most of the classes meet at nearby churches, and classes at Meadow Lark School will meet in the council's special classroom bus.

Miss Jones, whose office is at Nashville, Tenn., will address a public meeting at Ebbert Memorial Methodist Church, Springfield, at 2:30 p.m. standard, 3:30 daylight.

This meeting is for parents and teachers of all denominations. Topic for the session, and for the day, will be "The Whole Church Teaching and the Whole Church Learning."

In the evening, at 7:45 standard, 8:45 daylight, Miss Jones will meet with parents and teachers from the Lane Sub-division of the Methodist Church to discuss the new Methodist children's curriculum, scheduled to be released in 1964.

Author of Series

Miss Jones, who has had wide experience in church education, is the author of "Tell Me About God," "Tell Me About Jesus," and others in the "Tell Me" series, as well as a book for older children, "His Name Was Jesus." She has also written "The Faith of Our Children," a guide for parents and teachers.

Miss Jones is on a speaking tour of the western states. She will speak to Methodist ministers of the state on Sept. 8 at First Methodist Church, Salem, where she will discuss the pastor's responsibility of teaching youths contemplating membership in the church. This talk is scheduled from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. standard, 2:30 to 4:30 daylight, the Rev. Hitchcock said.
