

Girl Scout Volunteer Honored Charm Course Set at Y

Culmination of 18 years as a volunteer in Girl Scouting for Mrs. A. H. (Doris) Scott came with the surprise presentation of a Thanks Badge at the Skyline Picture Party Thursday evening at Harris Hall. The Thanks Badge is a most treasured award given to scouts in appreciation for their time and devotion to developing Girl Scouting. The presentation was made by Miss Allison Wyson, Senior Planning Board president, in behalf of all girls who have hiked the Skyline Trail.

Mrs. Scott, who is a vivacious grandmother, has given her time as a troop leader, camping consultant and other volunteer capacities, beginning when her oldest daughter was a second grade Brownie and continuing through until her youngest daughter was graduated from the program.

Organized Trips

Five years ago, because of her great love for hiking and the out of doors, she was asked by Three Rivers Council to organize a Senior Girl Camping Event, which would be an eight-day, back-packing trip along the Skyline Trail. The first year, 19 girls made the trip, and in 1962, the fourth year it has been held, 62 girls and nine adult leaders made the hike.

Mrs. Scott has served every year as planner, trainer, purchaser and trail leader. So far the girls have traveled three different sections of the trail. This year Mrs. Scott helped to design a sweat shirt with a special Skyline Trail emblem which was available to girls making

On Committee

In addition to her work as a leader, Mrs. Scott also serves on the Camping Committee for the Girl Scouts and is an American Red Cross First Aid instructor. She lives at 1801 Moss St., Eugene. She has a son in

Many Girl Scouts and their parents joined to view a movie made along the Skyline Trail this year by Mrs. Donald Conrad, Senior Planning Board Advisor and one of the adult leaders on the trail trip.

Personal Development and Charm, a course to be conducted by the Central Lane YM-YWCA, is designed to give to the Teen-age the ability to step gracefully into young adult life; to the career-business girl, confidence, as the stepping stone to bigger and better things; and to the homemaker, a stimulus for a happier life through broader interests.

Highlighted in the course will be:

Poise and Etiquette — This will include knowing the correct and graceful way to ascend and descend stairs; to put on and to remove coat and gloves; how to sit, stand, walk and to use one's hands gracefully. Also, introductions, table manners, restaurant manners, tipping and hotel etiquette will be taught.

Wardrobe Planning — A basic wardrobe will be planned to fit each person's own type of personality. Included will be line, color, texture and accessories.

Cosmetique — The skillful application of day and evening makeup will be taught during the course.

Speech and Personality — Students will learn to project their speech and personality by learning the speech tools and how to use them.

Posture and Figure Control — Figure faults will be pointed out and students will be taught how to improve them as well as learning how to stand and walk in correct posture.

In addition Teenagers will be taught how to talk and dress for business interviews, office etiquette, care of clothing and personal hygiene.

Instructor for the charm course is Mrs. Clarence (Adelle) Jenike, a graduate of Estelle Compton's Model Institute. She also has had special training in speech, social etiquette and wardrobe planning. Mrs. Jenike

had her own studio in Minnesota and taught etiquette to students in the Denver public school system before moving to Eugene with her husband last spring. In addition to her teaching at the Y, Mrs. Jenike is studying pre-law at University of Oregon.

Two courses will be offered for women, one on Thursdays, beginning Oct. 4 from 9 to 11 a.m.; the other to be Tuesdays from 7 to 9 p.m. beginning Oct. 2. A nursery is available for the morning course. The Teen-age Girls course will be Thursdays from 4 to 6 p.m., beginning Oct. 25.
