

Religious Leader to Conduct 'Spiritual Life Mission Here'

E. Stanley Jones, a missionary since 1907 and a Christian leader and author known throughout the world, will begin a "Spiritual Life Mission" in Eugene Sunday. The mission, and other appearances in the area, will continue through Friday.

He will speak twice daily at Friendly Street Church of God, Eugene, where his appearances will be co-sponsored by the Eugene Ministerial Assn.

The Rev. Jones, who prefers to be called an evangelist, which he translates as "the bearer of God," began his missionary service in India with low caste and outcaste groups under the Methodist mission board.

His presentation of the Gospel won him a hearing among India's educated classes and his ministry widened to this group.

Since 1919, his ministry has been world-wide and interdenominational.

At present, he divides his time equally between America and overseas nations. He returns to his first mission field, India, which he regards as the world's most crucial, each year.

In India, he established a Christian psychiatric center, the first in India.

He developed many missions there, founded schools and built a theological seminary, supporting much of this work by his own efforts. With Mrs. Jones, he works to provide scholarships for some 600 boys in schools in India.

He began his work of establishing Christian ashrams, or spiritual retreats, in India. This work has now become world-wide, with ashrams established in the United States, India,

Japan, Africa and Europe. These now number 50.

In the past year, the Rev. Jones has conducted successful missions and ashrams in nine countries. His recent speaking engagements have ranged from a special prayer service for 1,500 persons at the Pentagon in Washington, D.C., to gatherings of more than 50,000 persons in India.

He spends the first six months of each year in evangelistic work overseas. Each June, he returns to the United States and immediately begins a series of speaking engagements in various parts of the nation.

He schedules up to eight ash-

rams, 15 to 20 Christian missions and as many as 30 meetings in his crusade for a united church during these six months, in addition to work on a book manuscript.

The Rev. Jones is the author of 22 books, two of which — "Christ of the Indian Road" and "Abundant Living" — sold more than 1 million copies.

Jones' Topic: Church Unity

Christian unity will be the theme for the Rev. E. Stanley Jones at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday in Eugene at a special program sponsored by Eugene Council, United Church Women.

At the Wednesday program, which will be held at the Friendly Street Church of God, W. 23rd Avenue and Friendly Street, Jones — a nominee for the Nobel Peace Prize — will

have as his theme, "Christians Unite for a Christian America." The program will be open to the public.

Jones' program for a united church, which would provide for individual denominations to retain their identity under a plan of "federal union," will be explained at the meeting.

He first proposed his plan 15 years ago. Since that time, he

has explained the proposal in more than 400 cities of the United States.

Mrs. Walter Bearst, president of the Eugene council, will preside at the Wednesday meeting.

The Rev. Ray Tuttle, pastor of the host church, said Thursday that a number of special events have been planned in conjunction with Jones' series of appearances in Eugene.

A "chairman" for each evening program has been named, Tuttle said. Included are Leo Woodruff, minister of University Street Church of Christ and president of the Eugene Ministerial Assn.; the Rev. Walter Grey, Central Presbyterian Church; the Rev. Wesley Nicholson, First Congregational Church, and the Rev. Carlton Buck, First Christian Church.

In addition, the 70-voice choir from Warner Pacific College in Portland will sing at the concluding service Friday night.

Choirs and soloists from Eugene area churches will provide music for the other evening services, scheduled Sunday and Tuesday through Friday.

Retired Missioner Will Speak Here

A retired missionary to Japan who was decorated by the Emperor of Japan for her service will be in Eugene Sunday through Wednesday for a series of appearances.

Virginia Mackenzie, a former resident of Oregon, will be guest speaker Sunday morning at regular worship services at Leaburg and Waltherville Presbyterian churches.

She will speak at a joint meeting of the junior and senior high school fellowships of Central United Presbyterian Church, Eugene, Sunday at 6 p.m.

Monday, she will address a women's group of the Eugene church at a meeting at 7:30 p.m. at the church.

Tuesday, her schedule includes a coffee hour and program at 10 a.m. at Westminster Presbyterian Church; a program following a noon luncheon at Central Presbyterian; and a speech at the Waltherville church

family dinner Tuesday night.

Miss Mackenzie will be guest speaker Wednesday at 1 p.m. at a Women's Assn. program at Peace Presbyterian Church.

Her appearances in the Eugene-Springfield area are sponsored by the Women's Assn. of Central Presbyterian, who also will sponsor the Tuesday luncheon.

Miss Mackenzie came to Oregon from her native Scotland when she was 14 years old. She graduated from Reed College in Portland and taught for several years before her assignment to Japan in 1919 by the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions.

In Japan, she worked with educational institutions, and from 1940 to 1947, was executive secretary in the United States in charge of women's work of the foreign missions in 22 states.

Her last assignment in Japan was with a girls' school at Shimomoseki. She retired from the field in 1959.

For her work in Japan, the Emperor awarded her the Fourth Order of the Sacred Treasure, a medal and a citation.
