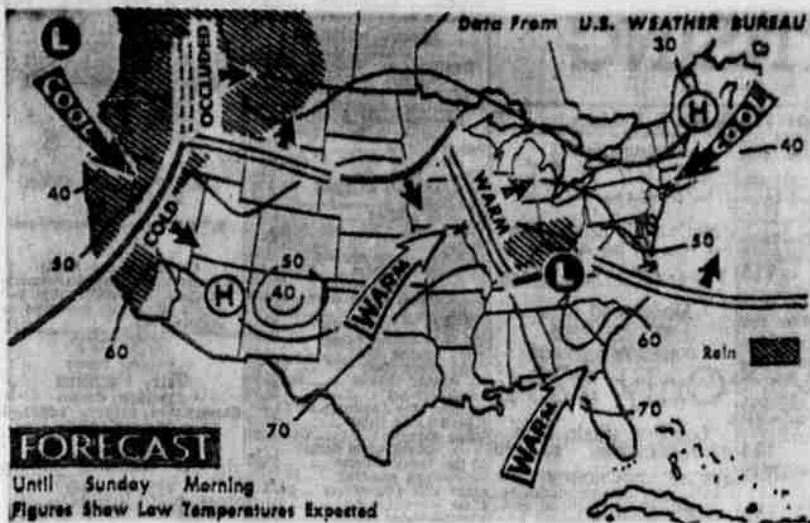

Man on Brink Of Milestone, Editor Says

Man has worked his way through four milestones in communications and now stands on the brink of the fifth, Eric W. Allen Jr., Medford newspaperman, said in Eugene Friday.

Allen, managing editor of the Medford Mail-Tribune, spoke at the opening session of the 38th annual Oregon High School Press Conference, sponsored by the University of Oregon School of Journalism and the Oregon Scholastic Press.

The first four milestones, Allen said, were:

- Development of speech.
- The written word.
- Development of movable type, which led to "the miracle of printing."
- Electronics communications systems.

What will the fifth milestone be? This remains to be seen, Allen said.

"The next breakthrough in communications, the fifth milestone, may be one of any number of things, or something else altogether," he said.

Allen listed these possibilities:

- The adoption of "a world-wide language, a lingua franca of mankind, which would allow us to leap the barriers imposed on us by the 3,000 or more separate languages and dialects now spoken by mankind."

- A breakthrough "in the infant science of semantics—the study of the meaning of words."

- A widened understanding "of the processes involved in teaching and learning."

"I do not predict any of these suggestions," Allen said. "I ask you to speculate upon them as possibilities, but only as possibilities."

And, he added, "I suggest that the young people in this room, who are here today because they are interested in communications, more than likely will have a major role in the development of the next breakthrough in communications, whatever it may be."

Teachers, students and those who deal in professional communications must lead the way, Allen said, "to a new breakthrough in man's ability to talk with his fellow man, and to understand him."
