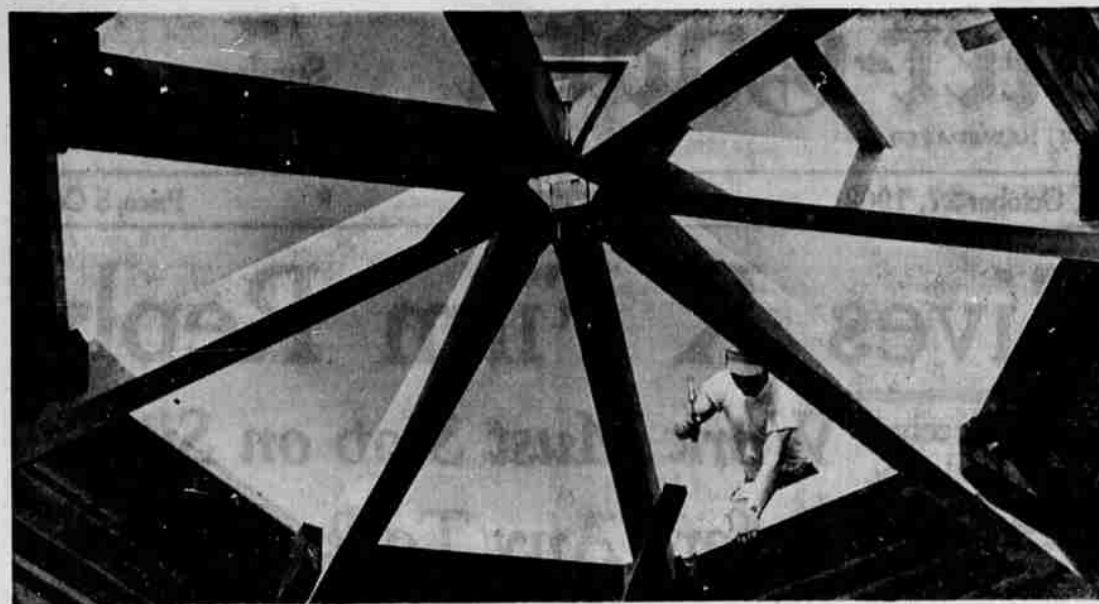




Looking Up

Lutheran Reformation Fete Planned in Eugene Sunday

The fourth annual Lutheran Reformation Festival in the Eugene-Springfield area will be held Sunday at 8 p.m. at Central Lutheran Church, 18th Avenue and Potter Street, Eugene.

This year's festival is being sponsored by the Eugene Lutheran Ministerial Assn., which has representatives from Lutheran Churches in Eugene, Springfield and Junction City who belong to the National Lutheran Council of Churches.

Speaker for this year's festival will be the Rev. Toivo Harjunpaa, professor of history and liturgics at Pacific Lutheran Seminary, Berkeley, Calif.

A native of Finland, Rev. Harjunpaa holds degrees from the University of Helsinki, the Uni-

versity of California, and Abo University in Finland.

From 1945 to 1948, he was chaplain to the Archbishop of Finland. He has held pastorates in the United States and served on a committee that aided in the formation of the present Service Book and Hymnal of Lutheran churches.

Elden Penttila, a teacher at Willamette High School and choir director at United Lutheran Church, will be director of a joint choir from the participating churches.

Liturgist will be the Rev. Olaf A. Anderson, pastor of Central Lutheran Church, and Mrs. James Walsh, also of Central church, will be organist. Members of the Lutheran Laymen's League will be ushers.

Chairman is Mrs. Robert Kingsbury of Eugene.

Springfield Pastor Gets District Post

The Rev. Wilbur I. Smith, of Springfield, was recently elected moderator of the district of Oregon for the Church of the Brethren.

Rev. Smith, pastor of Nicholas Garden Church of the Brethren, will also serve as secretary of the district board of administration.

He was elected to the post at the denomination's convention in Medford, where Jess Dunning, a member of the Springfield church, was named as the district's representative in the Oregon Council of Churches.

At the district conference, plans were approved for an administration realignment of Northwest church districts.

The districts of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and western Montana and western Canada, will become one unit. The boards of the old districts will meet in Portland in January for a planning session.

Eugene Woman Gets Africa Post

A 19-year-old Eugene woman will leave next month for missionary service in the Ivory Coast.

Paula Steinhauer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Luther C. Steinhauer, 1025 Sequoia St., has been accepted for service with the Conservative Baptist Foreign Missionary Society (CBFMS).

She will leave Eugene Nov. 19, fly to New York, and with Melba Means, another CBFMS missionary, leave for Europe and Africa.

Was "Recruited" Miss Means, the new worker said, "recruited" her.

The veteran missionary spoke at a church program in Eugene, and Miss Steinhauer's mother attended. Miss Means made an appeal for someone with secretarial experience to go to the Ivory Coast. Mrs. Steinhauer relayed the appeal to her daughter, who volunteered.

Miss Steinhauer will be working at a missionary post near Kohogo, a city of some 25,000 persons. The missionary station has five missionary families plus several single workers.

North High Graduate Miss Steinhauer is a 1961 graduate of North Eugene High School, and attended a Bible school in Los Angeles and the University of Oregon.

Her support during her missionary service will be provided by First Baptist Church, Eugene.

Methodist Hymn Fete Planned for Nov. 4

Final plans are now being made for a Methodist hymn festival Nov. 4 which will feature participation by Methodist choirs and congregations in the central Lane area.
