

Final Rites Set Tuesday For Man, 84

Funeral services for Noah Lee Helterbrand of Springfield, 84, a veteran of the Spanish-American War, will be in Springfield Tuesday.

Helterbrand died Saturday at his home, 639 C St., Springfield. He had been a resident of Springfield since 1917, and retired in 1946 after working as a planer operator for Booth-Kelly Lumber Co. for 28 years.

In the Spanish-American War, he was a sergeant. Helterbrand served as camp commander of General Lawton Camp, Spanish-American War Veterans, Eugene, in 1952-53. He also was a member of Neighborhood of Woodcraft.

Survivors include his wife, Nellie; two daughters, Jewel Berndt of Yakima, Wash., and Pearl McLagan of Portland; five grandchildren, four brothers, four sisters and numerous nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be Tuesday at 10:30 a.m. at Buell Chapel, Springfield, with the Rev. James Fraley, pastor of Springfield Christian Church officiating. Interment will be in Mt. Vernon Cemetery.

Chemist Unopposed For Park Position

Park's Halloween Carnival Expected to Draw Crowd

Hundreds of Springfield area youngsters are expected to participate in the Willamalane Park District's annual Halloween Carnival.

Sponsored by the Willamalane Recreation Council, the annual Halloween event is receiving planning assistance from virtually every Springfield civic and service organization.

If the children are at home, a witch's wagon will be dispatched with a special prize for the winners.

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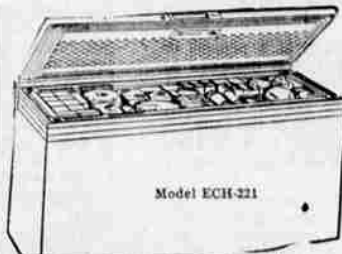
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
