Whatever It Needs, Show Ain't Got It

HOLLYWOOD—This, in part, is how ABC-TV hopefully advertised its new series, "Stoney Burke," before the season started:

"Build a show around the spills and thrills of the rodeo circuit, put it into the 9 p.m. spot on Monday night, following 'The Rifleman,' leading into 'Ben Casey'... and you're coming on strong."

... Your audience is there. Waiting. This was abundantly demonstrated on March 11 on 'ABC's Wide World of Sports,' when the Tucson rodeo rode off with a 21.4 rating. Far and away the No. 1 program for the entire time period from 5 to 6:30 p.m. "Whatever it takes to make it big, 'Stoney Burke' has it. Big."

He Went Thataway
Well, Stoney came on strong all right, but I'm afraid he went thataway. Whatever it takes to make it big, Stoney ain't got it. Big.

From a popularity viewpoint, it is somewhat of a surprise Stoney is not doing better despite the competition of Danny Thomas and Andy Griffith on CBS-TV. The proven popularity of rodeos, plus the generous script helpings of sex, violence and sensuality on a primitive level, looked like money in the bank, and may yet be.

As an earnest effort, the series is in a comically ironic position. Stoney, a would-be rodeo champ, is billed as the hero of a sort of modern-day morality play in which he is an uncompromising fellow. Yet his creators are in the position of having to compromise each week if they hope to stay alive in the video ratings, unless they show themselves to be as independent as their hero — which they have not done so far.

Second-Rate 'Perry Mason'
The result is that Stoney doesn't compromise, but the plots around him do. Monday night, for instance, it was like watching a second-rate "Perry Mason" as Stoney was sued when his horse crashed a rodeo fence and fatally injured a woman spectator.

It was a rodeo set, but everything else was the same that you have seen countless times—the detective work in cowboy duds instead of city clothes and the eventual revelation of a murder scheme by others. The only twist was that the killing

Republican Solon Suggests 'Truce'

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. George D. Aiken, R-Vt., called fellow Republicans Tuesday to observe a one-year truce on intraparty battling over a 1964 presidential nominee.

Aiken said there should be a "cooling-off" period to forestall an 18-month struggle between GOP conservatives and liberals for control of the party.

Aiken, fresh from his own re-election victory in Vermont, told an interviewer he is not plugging for any candidate himself. "I don't believe we should be in any hurry to select a candidate," he said.
