

Labor Chiefs Delay Filling Council Post

Meany, Reuther Avoid Showdown

WASHINGTON (AP) — Organized labor's two top leaders have avoided for a third time a showdown in their clash over filling a vacant post on the AFL-CIO Executive Council.

The council approved Monday a proposal by George Meany, AFL-CIO president, and Walter Reuther, Auto Workers Union chief, to do some more talking with each other in an effort to reach a peaceful solution.

Apparently forgotten for the moment was Reuther's reported threat to pull his union out of the AFL-CIO fold. Reuther issued a statement saying it is more necessary than ever to maintain a united labor movement.

The two leaders have been having a variety of differences ever since the old CIO and the AFL were merged in 1955. Their immediate controversy is over filling a vacancy on the 29-man council.

Reuther, former head of the CIO, has nominated President Ralph Helstein of the Packinghouse Workers Union, a man who Meany is said to find unacceptable.

Another conflict between the two top leaders is Meany's refusal to accept President James B. Carey of the Electrical Workers Union as an alternate delegate to Reuther to the International Brotherhood of Free Trade Unions. Reuther is said to feel he should be free to pick his own alternate. Here again a decision was expected to be postponed.

Boy Scout Recognition Banquet Set

The annual recognition banquet of Oregon Trail Council of Boy Scouts will be held at the University of Oregon on Dec. 9. Some 500 Scout leaders and their wives are expected to attend. The theme of this year's banquet is "Strengthen America—Character Counts."

At this banquet the institutions sponsoring Scout units express their appreciation to Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, Explorer advisors and their wives. Gunnar H. Berg, recently retired national director of professional training for Boy Scouts of America, will be the main speaker. He held the national post from 1944 until his retirement last June.

Berg has been in Scouting work since the 1920s. He holds master's and doctoral degrees from Columbia University Teachers College. Council President Jack Danby has announced that council executive board members and members-at-large will attend operating committee meetings starting at 2 p.m. the day of the banquet. Institutional representatives are also being invited. The banquet will be held in the Erb Memorial Union building on the campus. Brian Graves is in charge of arrangements.

Printing Accident Makes Stamps Collector's Items

WASHINGTON (AP) — Post offices throughout the country Tuesday rummaged through their stock to see if they have any of the 400 Dag Hammarskjöld commemorative stamps made collectors' items by a printing error.

The Post Office Department ordered a temporary halt to sales of the four-cent stamps Monday while the check is being made.

So far the whereabouts of 100 of the stamps are known. One set of 50 was bought in Ohio and another set in New Jersey. The black and yellow Hammarskjöld stamp was issued Oct. 24. In a printing accident, the yellow color came out upside down on two sheets of 200 stamps apiece.

With 400 of the misprinted stamps known to be in circulation, their value to collectors has decreased. They would have been far more valuable if only one sheet of 200 had been put on sale.

One reason the postal department wants to halt sales and check inventories is to determine just how many of the stamps are in public hands. Such information is vital to collectors.

The Post Office Department is wasting no time blushing over the boo-boo. It proudly points out that it's the first time in 44 years that an imperfection has slipped onto the market—and it turns out billions of stamps yearly.

The last time was 1918, when 50 imperfect 24-cent air mail stamps were circulated.

Five Natives Killed on Guam

Typhoon Leaves 45,000 Homeless

HONOLULU (AP) — Shattering Typhoon Karen left at least five natives dead on Guam, damage in the hundreds of millions of dollars and 45,000 persons homeless.

Acting Gov. Manuel Guerrero described the destruction as "much more serious than that of 1944" when U.S. troops liberated the island from Japan.

Hundreds were reported injured, but no exact count has come from the western Pacific island, still out of communications except for a few emergency circuits. Hospitals and medical centers handled a steady stream of casualties, sparse reports said.

174 Miles an Hour

The typhoon crashed across the tiny island hub of U.S. military defenses in the western Pacific late Sunday night and Monday morning with winds reaching 174 miles an hour.

As Guam dug out of the blitz, Karen rumbled across the Pacific toward Okinawa and im-

portant American military bases there.

The U.S. Air Force's 54th Weather Reconnaissance Squadron located the typhoon 657 miles west-northwest of Guam at 9 a.m. Tuesday. Winds in the eye were gauged at a potent 167 miles an hour.

The U.S. Weather Bureau in Honolulu said the typhoon could brush the northern Philippine Islands within the next 24 to 48 hours.

The Japanese Maritime Safety Agency in Tokyo said one Japanese fishing boat—the 39-ton Daiyumarui—has been unheard from since Monday midnight. The boat, with 15 aboard, was operating northwest of Guam when the storm hit. Had Guam not had a three-day warning that the monstrous tropical blow—the worst in the island's history—was coming, countless numbers would have died, the Navy has said.

More than half the 40,000 natives and 30,000 military personnel and dependents were left

homeless. All civilian communications facilities were knocked out, schools were destroyed and 90 per cent of all civilian buildings on the island were damaged beyond repair, Guerrero's report said. There was no word on the extent of damages to military installations.

Damages Soar

First official word of the devastation wrought by Karen came from Guerrero's headquarters to Honolulu via civil defense emergency facilities.

Edwin Engledow, Guerrero's press secretary, said damages were "well into the hundreds of millions of dollars."

The exact number of injured was not mentioned either in Engledow's message or a later Navy announcement, which placed deaths at five. Engledow said six were dead.

President Kennedy declared the island—under U.S. jurisdiction since 1898—a disaster area, making it eligible for federal loans to rebuild.

American Red Cross headquarters in Tokyo said 45,000 residents had been left homeless by the typhoon.
