

4-H Clubs in Lane County Increase 47 Per Cent

All signs point to a superlative year for Lane 4-Hers in 1963. As of Dec. 1, the number of clubs in the county was 47 per cent ahead of last year's total.

And 1962 is not a year to write off lightly, according to J. R. Gorton, Lane extension agent in 4-H club work. Lane 4-Hers increased total enrollment by 9 per cent, the number of projects they carried by 14 per cent.

Throughout the county, organization of 4-H clubs is booming as an increased number of adults become leaders in the youth program. Sponsored by Lane Extension Service, Oregon State University and the United States Department of Agriculture, free 4-H training is available for every youngster, nine years of age and older.

The 1963 organization of clubs will continue until May 1. Already the roster of 49 clubs includes three in the forestry project, nine in livestock, 15 in clothing, 11 in foods, nine in health; two in

arts and crafts; two in community clubs and one rock hound club.

Originally, youthful aspiration and humor show through in the names 4-Hers give their clubs: Dr. Kildaire Health Club; Fumbling Thimbles Sewing Club; Fudge and Cake Foods Club; Champie Champs Livestock Club.

Grove Police List 23 Criminal Arrests

COTTAGE GROVE—Twenty-three criminal arrests were made by the Cottage Grove Police Department during November, reports Chief Carl Rumpf. Nine of the 23 were juvenile offenders.

Florence Port Officials Back South Jetty Recreation Road

FLORENCE—Siuslaw Port Commissioners were in general agreement here Wednesday night that a maximum effort should be made to get a road through to the south jetty to open the area for recreation. However, they noted it wasn't going to be easy. Norman Price, commission secretary, said the main difficulty lay in getting Lane County, Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management (BLM) officials together to act jointly on the matter, "because of the possibility of a national seashore park being established in the area."

"No one wants to build a road because the park service would tie it up. Price said. The commission has budgeted \$10,000 which could be used to get the road started. Initial construction, if started, would extend the county road on Glenada Hill just south of the bridge to a fence line paralleling the foredune. The distance would be approximately two miles. Members had hopes a Forest Service road running into the general area from Siltcoos Outlet might connect with the commission's road, and a cooperative effort be made to extend activities to the south jetty.
