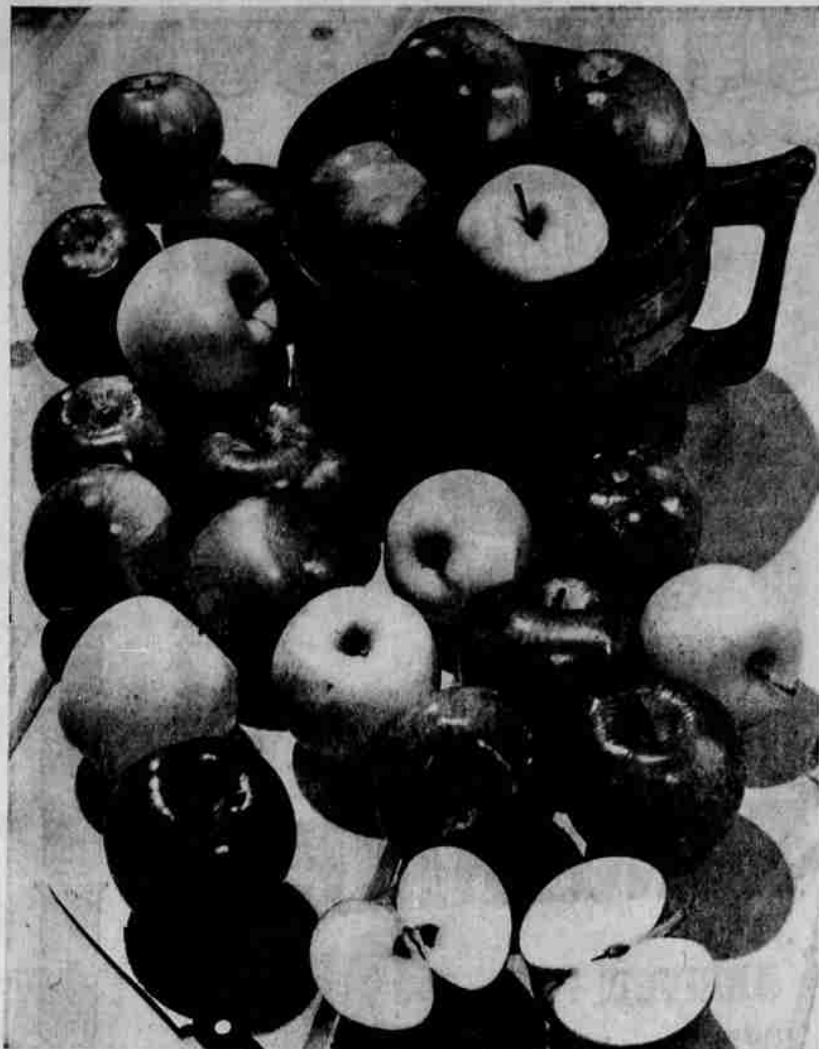




Oregon Santas Send Gift Boxes of Apples

They pack easily; they transport well; and fruit grown and personally mailed from the Willamette Valley has a gift status all its own.

Look to your local orchards for the many varieties: Golden Delicious, sweet, crisp, and tender, as delicious raw as cooked; Red Delicious, sweet and fragrant; Rome Beauty, juicy, slightly tart, wonderful baked; Yellow Newton, juicy and tart, easily utilized either cooked or raw; Jonathan and Northern Spy.

Tuck in with your gift a copy of the bulletin, "Apples in Appealing Ways," free from Lane Extension Service by calling DI 2-1311, Ext. 201. You'll want a copy for yourself, too, when you'd make French Apple pie, apple fritters, apple stuffing for thick pork chops.

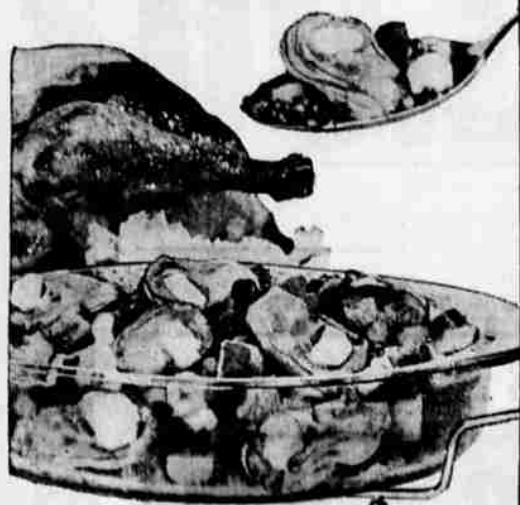
Do try apples in new and different ways, the agent urges. Top a pork roast with apple rings. Dress up an acorn squash with a filling of chopped apples, brown sugar, butter, a dash of nutmeg.

Want a refreshing salad? Core unpared apples, slice in thin cross sections and alternate with orange slices and onion rings with a clear tart oil dressing. Or delight the youngsters with "Party baked" apples—filled with crushed pineapple, topped with a roasted marshmallow.

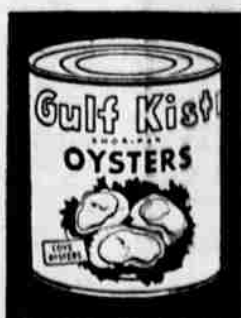
Never enough apples at your house? "Bought by the box" apples are lower priced. But do temper quantity purchase by storage facilities and the knowledge of how fast your family goes through a box. Store apples in a cool place. Or refrigerate in polyethylene bags to keep them crisp and juicy.

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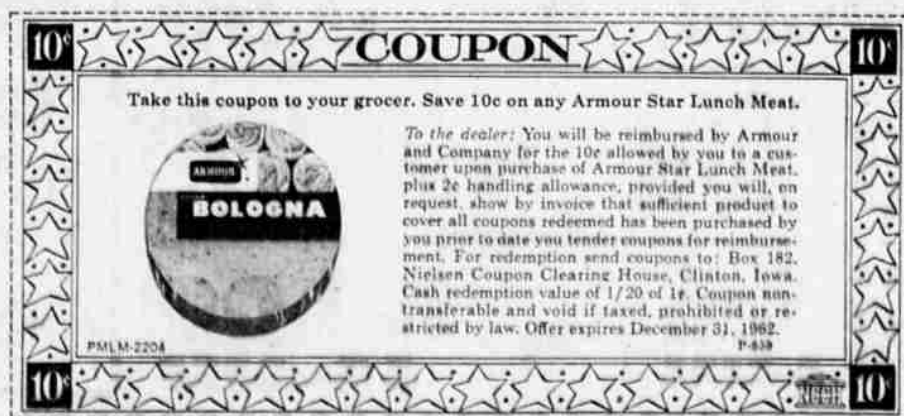
