

Religious Forum Opens Sunday at UO

Four-Day Event to Include Five Lectures, Two Panels

With the theme "Religion in Life," this year's Religious Forum Week on the University of Oregon campus, will open Sunday and continue through Wednesday night.

This year's program, with five major lectures on the general theme, "In Search of Meaning," and two panel discussions including participants from the Eugene-Springfield area, will feature four men and one woman—all recognized for contributions in the field of religion as well as in their professions.

The participants are:

- Dr. Camilla M. Anderson, representing psychiatry. A practicing psychiatrist for 32 years, she is presently director of the outpatient department of the Oregon State Hospital in Salem. Doctor Anderson is the author of three books and has a fourth manuscript scheduled for publication in the near future.

- David Bassan, representing business. He is assistant to the president of ABC Life Insurance Co. and an administrator of group insurance plans for teachers in California. He is a member of the Bureau of Jewish Education, the American Assn. for Jewish Education and the Los Angeles Hillel Council Board, in addition to other posts.

- Dr. Ralph Byron, representing science, medicine and social work. He is presently chief of oncologic (tumor) and general surgery and director of the Hospital for Tumor and Allied Diseases at the City of Hope Medical Center in Duarte, Calif. He is author or co-author of 42 books on surgical methodology and cancer treatment, and is a member of various professional organizations.

- J. Edwin Orr, representing scholarship and education. At present a traveling lecturer, Orr has been on the faculty of the University of Chicago, and has just returned to the United States from a lecture series in Europe. He is the author of numerous books, and is a member of the Royal Society of Literature, the Royal Historical Society and the American Historical Assn.

- The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas J. Tobin, Portland, representing the field of labor and management. He is pastor of All Saints Church, vicar general of the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, and a delegate to the Second Vatican Council in Rome. In the labor-management field, he is vice president of the Catholic Conference on Industrial Problems.

Each of the speakers will give a main address, developing the theme, "In Search of Meaning," with reference to his or her main field.

During the week, they will be guest speakers at a number of University of Oregon class sessions and at living organizations during the noon and dinner hour. They will also be guests of the campus religious organization of their faith or denomination.

Several have also planned appearances at Eugene or Springfield organizations.

All main lectures, panel discussions and question periods will be open to the public without charge.

The first panel discussion Tuesday at 4 p.m. will be on the topic, "A Man and His Family," and will be moderated by Scott Nobles, associate professor of speech at the University of Oregon.

Panelists from the Religious Forum Week speakers will be Bassan and Doctor Byron. Mrs. W. L. Pew of Eugene, a homemaker, and Dr. Wayne Paxton, a clinical psychologist for the Lane County Juvenile Department, will be Eugene area participants.

The second panel will be Wednesday at 4 p.m., again with Nobles as moderator. Monsignor Tobin and Orr will represent the speakers, and Edward V. Leavy, Lane County Circuit Court judge, and Bessie Campbell, bridal consultant for the Bon Marche Russells, Eugene, will be local participants.

Topic will be "A Man and His Neighbor."

Sponsor of the week is the University Religious Council, an organization of representatives from campus religious groups.

The student committee in charge of the week is headed by James Orrell of Eugene. Other student chairmen are Eric McCready of Eugene, David Perry of Salem, Diane Gabbert of Santa Monica, Calif., Peg Liner of Berkeley, Calif., Mary D. Casebeer of Glendale, Jane Tjomsland of Vancouver, Wash., Lee Winters of Sunnyvale, Calif., and Valerie Marcellino of Hilo, Hawaii.

Health Frauds Target of Probe

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Health frauds inflicted on elderly persons suffering from arthritis will be investigated at a three-day Senate hearing starting next Tuesday.

Sen. Pat McNamara, D-Mich., said his Senate special committee on aging will hear officials of the American Medical Assn., the Arthritis and Rheumatic Foundation and the Consumers Union.

"Letters coming in from interested citizens through the country reflect a growing interest in frauds affecting the elderly," McNamara said in a statement.

"We hope to provide the older citizen with the information and safeguards he needs to protect him from ineffective 'cures,' misrepresentation, false retirement plans and other frauds designed to fleece the unwary."
