Dodge-Calvert

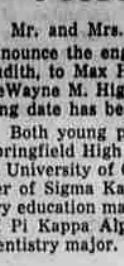

Bour-Peterson



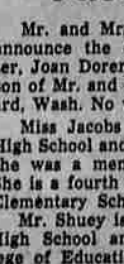

Becker-Mike

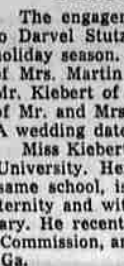

Kiebert-Stutz

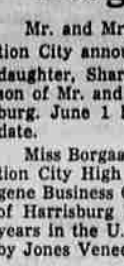

Borgaard-Willis

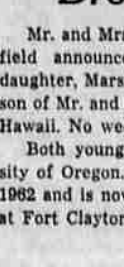

Miss Bates Recent Bride

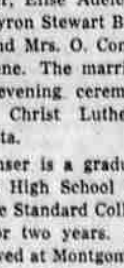

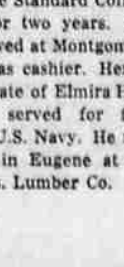
Pair Makes June Plans

Hill-Gordinier



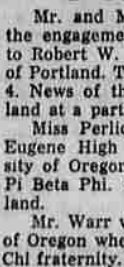
