Business Beat

Credit-Based Firms Fewer Here

The number of business firms that sell or buy on credit (representing about half of the total number of firms operating) dropped off slightly in 1962 in Eugene and most other Lane County cities.

Dun & Bradstreet, Inc., Portland, an international business service firm, reports that as of Dec. 31, 1962 there were 2,573 credit-reporting firms in operation in Lane County. That is 35 fewer such firms than were operating at the end of 1961.

There were 1,670 credit-reporting firms in Eugene at the end of 1962 — seven less than the previous year. Cottage Grove had 138 such firms in 1962, six less than 1961. Junction

City, at 74 businesses last year, was down three; Florence, at 94 was down two.

Only in Springfield, where the number increased from 323 to 336, was there a gain noted. Dun & Bradstreet reports. The diminishing numbers are part of a statewide trend, a D&B spokesman said. Portland and Salem also recorded fewer businesses of that kind last year than in the year before.

The decrease for Eugene was actually "much less" than for other parts of the state, the firm said. The figures do not indicate the level of general business activity, and no report is made for types of businesses that do not use credit — such as small private contractors, real estate firms, and many service and professional businesses.

MEAT-CUTTER CREDIT UNION TO MEET — The Meat Cutter No. 324 Federal Credit Union will hold its annual business meeting and election Monday at 8 p.m. in room 103 of the Eugene Labor Temple.

The credit union, formed in April of 1961, has grown from a membership of 109 as of Dec. 31, 1961 to 148 as of the same date, 1962, according to Irene Emmmons, treasurer. She said assets have grown from \$9,500 to \$18,900 in the same time, and that the credit union last year paid a 5 per cent dividend rate to shareholders.

The organization is open to members of Local 324, Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butchers Workmen of North America, AFL-CIO.
