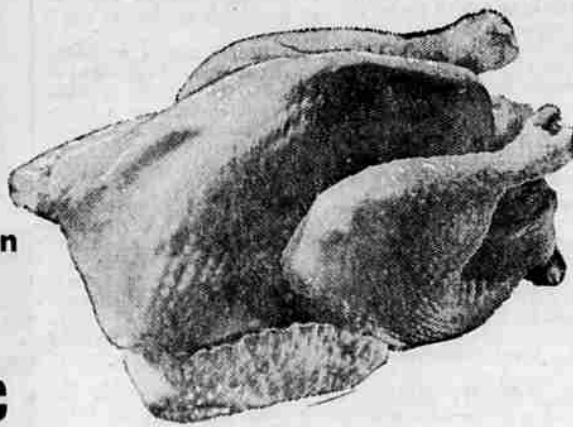

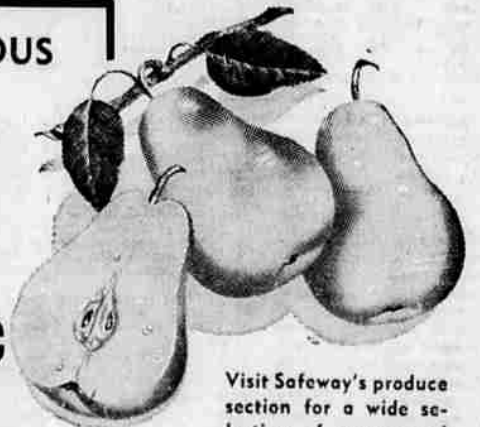

20 Injured in Crash

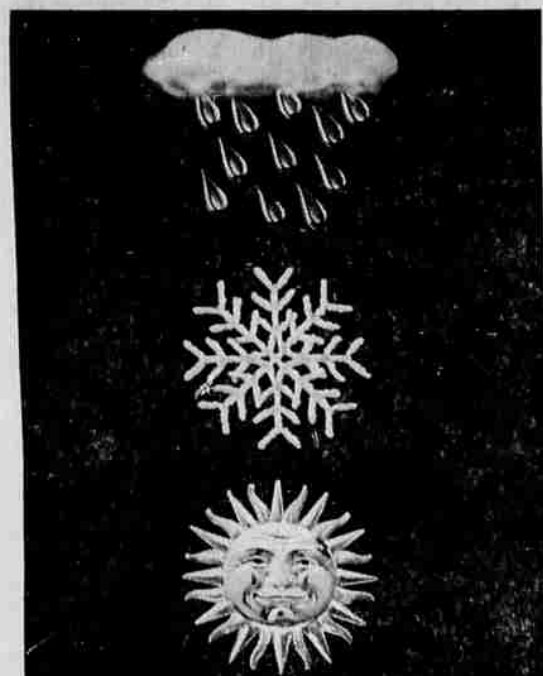
CARMEI, Maine (AP)—Twenty persons were injured Sunday when two Greyhound buses collided head-on in light fog three miles west of Carmel.
