Khrushchev's Son-in-Law Meets Privately With Pope

VATICAN CITY (AP)—Pope John XXIII unexpectedly summoned Soviet Premier Khrushchev's son-in-law to a private audience Thursday. They chatted for 18 minutes in the pontiff's library.

Alexei Adzhubei, who calls himself a confirmed atheist, was accompanied by his wife, Rada, dressed in black and wearing no makeup.

It was the first meeting of a Roman Catholic pontiff and a leading figure from the Communist Soviet Union. Adzhubei is editor of the Soviet government paper, Izvestia.

It was not learned what the Pope and the Adzhubeis talked about. Vatican custom is not to disclose details of the Pope's conversations to private audiences.

But a Vatican source said the meeting was informal. He said the Pope greeted the Adzhubeis at the door of the library and Adzhubei bowed his head and shook hands with the Pope. They then sat in chairs placed informally in a corner of the room, rather than at the pontiff's desk.

The Adzhubeis had come to the Vatican along with 70 other newsmen for a general audience in which the 81-year-old Roman Catholic leader received the \$51,000 Balzan Peace prize.

Pope John said the prize—praised by Premier Khrushchev—honored the "constant action of the Roman Catholic Church and the papacy for peace."

Popes and the Church, he said,

were able to act in "perfect supernatural neutrality."

"Such neutrality is not intended to be purely passive, as if the Pope's competence were limited to observing happenings and maintaining silence," the pontiff said. "On the contrary, it is a neutrality which confirms all the Church's vigor of testimony."

"A beautiful speech," said Adzhubei as the Pope finished speaking.

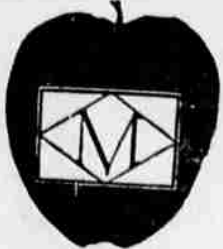
Students Plan 100 Mile Hike

Cuban Caves Ammo Depots?

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Army's intelligence chief says the Soviets may be storing ammunition, military vehicles and aircraft in thousands of caves in Cuba—are aren't letting even top Cuban military personnel get close enough to have a look.

"Aerial photography has further revealed the extension of roads to known and suspect caves locations," Maj. Gen. Alva R. Fitch told the Senate armed services subcommittee Wednesday, "and it is considered highly probable that much military equipment and supplies are being stored underground."

At the same time, Fitch discounted recurring reports by Cuban refugees that offensive missiles or bombers are being hidden in the caves.

"It is our belief that the Soviets did, in fact, remove all strategic weapons systems that were in Cuba at the time the quarantine was imposed," he said. "No nuclear warheads are believed to be in Cuba although

it is possible that they could be used by some of the weapons systems present there."

A censored version of Fitch's report to the subcommittee, which is investigating the Soviet Military buildup in Cuba, was made public after he testified.

Among other things he told the senators:

"There are no indications that Soviet ground force units have departed from Cuba other than those associated with the intermediate and medium-range missile systems."

"Our combined intelligence effort shows that there has been a substantial increase both in quantity and quality of heavy equipment in Cuba during the past year, much of it modern, including tanks, artillery, mortars and motor transport vehicles."

If the caves are air conditioned and dehumidified they might serve as storage places for "both large and delicate electronic items."

Indications are that the activity around the caves is being conducted solely by Soviet personnel, with Cuban military brass barred.

While Fitch was testifying, Republicans were maintaining their drumfire of criticism on the way the Kennedy administration dealt with the buildup last fall.

"We know the Russians were bringing in a lot of stuff months before the President took action," said Sen. George D. Aiken, R-Vt. "People in the

know expressed concern to me as long ago as last April."

And Sen. John Tower, R-Tex., said in a separate interview that "in view of the number of members of Congress who had information on the Soviet missiles in Cuba long before the President acted, it seems the administration should have had it, too."

Utility Firms Reach Accord

SALEM (AP)—Two utility companies have reached agreement to exchange property and end duplication of service at Tongue Point in Clatsop County, it was announced Wednesday.

Public Utility Commissioner Jonel C. Hill termed the settlement a "milestone in regulatory achievement."

Involved in the settlement were Pacific Power & Light Co. and West Oregon Electric Co-operative.

"The PUC, by virtue of provisions in Oregon's utility area allocation law, was able to bring the two firms together and work with them until a settlement was reached, preventing the competitive situation from adding more duplicated facilities," Hill said.

Under terms of the agreement PP&L will take over West Oregon's facilities serving the U.S. Maritime Commission base and will continue to serve all present and future customers there.

West Oregon will take over PP&L's lines and customers in the Necanicum Junction area west of Cannon Beach in southwestern Clatsop County.

Faubus Says Air Guardsmen Involved in Cuban Invasion

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP)—Gov. Orval Faubus accused the federal government Wednesday of secretly recruiting Arkansas National Guard pilots of the 1962 Cuban invasion and then "betraying" them.

Some of them flew in combat and one Air Guard plane was shot down, Faubus said.

Brig. Gen. Frank Bailey, chief of staff of the Arkansas Air National Guard, said he did not know what Faubus was talking about. But he added the Arkansas Air Guard "did not have any planes involved."

The Defense Department in Washington declined comment.

Faubus did not say who recruited the pilots. He said he knew at the time of the invasion that Arkansas Air Guard pilots were involved, but could say nothing at the time.

"These patriotic Americans were led to believe that this enterprise had not only the blessing but the full support of the federal government," he said. "We all know what happened at the Bay of Pigs."

"This whole thing is a disgrace in American history. They tried to recruit some men in the North and couldn't do it, so they came down to the South where they still have some patriotism and got some volunteers among the National Guard."

He said there were a dozen Arkansas guard pilots based in Nicaragua, some of whom flew combat missions in the invasion.

He said the pilots were sworn to secrecy, lest their part in the action jeopardize their military careers. If the Kennedy administration did not intend to support the invasion, Faubus said, the pilots "shouldn't have been sent in."

"The guardsmen didn't go for money or as soldiers of fortune," Faubus said. "They thought they were going in the national interest."

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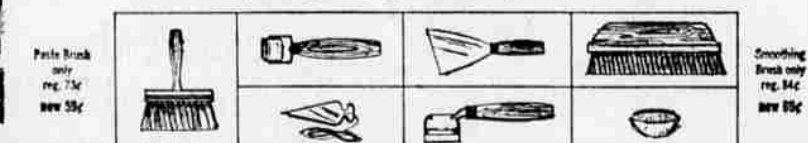
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
