Television in Review

Skelton Suffers From Padding

HOLLYWOOD—It is treason to suggest that CBS-TV's Tuesday Red Skelton show is not half as good since it became twice as long? And that it is frequently a stinkero?

Having thus condemned my mailman to the weight of the dropped letter brigade, I offer the following anecdote about the time a television potentate tried nightly to convince Edward G. Robinson to do a series, starting at \$5,000 a week and finally promising \$12,000. This was the actor's reply: "If I had already done your series and your money was in my bank account, I would not in the slightest feel better, richer or uplifted."

Pads Out Show

Natures and bank accounts vary, but I wish that Skelton had talked to Robinson, or somebody, before he agreed to his extended video duty, an hour instead of 30 minutes. As matters now stand, and Tuesday night was a typical example, you can watch the comedian's opening monologue, go away for 40 minutes and come back for his closing pantomime sketch, devoting your new-found spare time to some-

thing awful, like breaking Frankie Avalon records.

For in this 40 minutes or so, we see the painful results of padding out a show—the elongated sketches, the desperate musical production numbers. Tuesday night, for instance, they pulled out the old Bavarian polka routine (no kidding) for the chorus. And a skit in which Skelton played a sad-sack who invents a hair-growing substance was so endless that it was actually punctuated by two commercial breaks.

Still A Wonder

On ABC-TV recently, Sid Caesar murdered this trend of "longer-the-better" in a sequence called "Endless Theatre." It began with him getting off a Paris-to-New York plane, suddenly remembering he forgot his gloves and making another round-trip to pick them up.

Skelton, despite his increasing crudity in the overlong skits, is nevertheless a wonder. He is a great, infectious monologist and physical comedian. He noted Tuesday night that California would be nice when it's finished. He made his pantomime of a backstage janitor much better than his material. It is impossible not to catch the warmth of that funny face. But the tip-off is that Marilyn Maxwell sang three songs in her mid-show guest spot; she is a nice gal, but hearing her three songs approaches torture.

The Channel Swim: NBC-TV confirmed that Robert Taylor will star next season in a weekly series based on the field activities of the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare. He portrays a special assistant to the secretary. The network says the dramas will be fictionalized but semi-documentary in approach. Robert Loggia costars as Taylor's right-hand man.

Secretary of the Interior Stewart Udall guests Monday on ABC-TV's "Discovery '63." Also Monday, Postmaster-General Edward Day visits NBC-TV's "Today" show. Same network's Jack Paar plays host March 29 to Brooks Hays, special assistant to President Kennedy in international affairs.

Loquacious Boxer Among Best Known

NEW YORK — David Brinkley, Charles de Gaulle and Cassius Clay were the best known names in a list of 37 VIPs used as an identity quiz for 67 freshmen at Western Kentucky State College recently.

Brinkley was identified by 66 of the students; De Gaulle by 65, and boxer Clay by 64. On the other end of the scale, 62 were unable to identify correctly Associate Justice Byron White of the Supreme Court; 55 missed Senate Minority Leader Everett Dirksen; 53 didn't know Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield — one student thought he was a movie star. One student among the 36 who missed the correct identification of the artist Pablo Picasso, thought he was a tennis player.

Fifty-six students could not identify Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare Anthony J. Celebrezze.

Television names, generally, did pretty well in the test. Only six students missed Dick Van Dyke, and nine, Carol Burnett. Fourteen, incredible as it may sound, were unable to peg Richard and Burton — the same number that failed to recognize baseball player Stan Musial.

Results of the quiz were sent to NBC's newscaster David Brinkley by the woman English instructor who gave the test. Upshot of the test is that she assigned all 67 to read a daily newspaper and weekly news magazines. Obviously, they already watch television.

Venezuelan Officials Investigate Sabotage

CARACAS, Venezuela (U.P.) — Sabotage of two pipelines Tuesday held down the flow of crude oil to the Lake Maracaibo refinery of the American-owned Creole Petroleum Corp., but officials said production had not been curtailed.

The pipelines were ripped open Sunday night by bombs thrown by men the Venezuelan government said were followers of Cuban Prime Minister Fidel Castro.

Triple-Threat Night on TV May Lead to Dial-Juggling

Tonight is triple-threat night on the old TV, but it'll take some dial juggling to take it in. For viewing you can have your choice of Bob Hope & Co. at 9 p.m. on channels 13 and 8, the Bell Telephone Hour on the same channels at 10 p.m., or another of those specials on Hollywood at 10 p.m. on channels 9 and 12.

Hope will have three singers as guests—Frank Sinatra, Robert Goulet and youthful Brenda Lee. Edie Adams introduces the 1963 "Hollywood Deb Stars," a dozen young actresses.

As usual, the Bell Telephone Hour will offer the viewer the full range from classical to popular music. Leontyne Price does two arias from Verdi's "Il Trovatore," and Erica Morini does Bruch's "Concerto No. 1 for Violin." Both are fine performances.

Carol Lawrence sings and dances her way through some Johann Strauss waltzes. Steve Lawrence and Eydie Gorme handle the pop music.

"Hollywood: The Great Stars" promises to be a great show. Packed into a nostalgic hour are scenes from films like "The Westerner," "It Happened One Night," "Casablanca," "On the Waterfront," "Milk and Honey," "The Wind."

Stars featured include Katharine Hepburn, Spencer Tracy, Errol Flynn, Hedy Lamarr, Charles Boyer, Marlene Dietrich, and others. Two special features are a superbly edited recap of James Cagney's tough guy portrayals and an account of Marilyn Monroe's brief "Golden Girl" reign. Henry Fonda is host.
