Against His Own Baltimore Colts

Rosenbloom Accused of Making Bet

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Carroll D. Rosenbloom, owner of the Baltimore Colts, has been accused in federal court of betting \$55,000 against his own team in a 1953 National Football League game. Rosenbloom's own lawyer put the accusation on the record Tuesday in an attempt to have ex-gambler Mike McLaney, of Miami Beach, who made the

deposition three years ago, cited for criminal contempt. He said the charge was a vicious and outrageous lie. But Judge George C. Young threw out the contempt motion, emphasizing that he was not ruling on the truth or falsity of the accusation. Also made public Tuesday were three affidavits in which

McLaney's associates swore that Rosenbloom was a big better. National Football League regulations forbid betting by players or owners. Robert J. McGravey, once a Philadelphia detective, declared that he was Rosenbloom's personal assistant from 1951 to 1954 and that he had often placed bets for him.

Richard Melvin, an investor, said in his affidavit, "I distinctly remember that during one professional season he made nine straight winning bets on professional football games." Larry E. Murphy, onetime McLaney chauffeur, swore, "I particularly remember that in 1953 when his team was playing against the 49ers on the coast, Rosenbloom bet a large amount of money against his own team, and because of the point spread, won the bet."

But Judge Young said he construed the sealing orders to apply only to the Rosenbloom-McLaney contract law suit.

Rosenbloom's lawyers hammered hard at McLaney's specific charge of a \$55,000 bet against the Colts in 1953. McLaney testified at first that the bet was against the Colts in a game with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

"This was utter fabrication," said Jerome Doyle, Rosenbloom's attorney. "No such football game took place." But McLaney's lawyer insisted that his client was talking about another game. The Colts played the 49ers twice that year and lost 39-21 and 45-15. McLaney had sworn that Rosenbloom left several of his best players at home for the game.

Effect Seen On Athlete Enrollment

Future enrollment of transfer and out-of-state athletes at the University of Oregon is likely to be affected by new entrance requirements approved Tuesday by the State Board of Higher Education.

But UO athletic department officials weren't ready to predict how great the effect will be.

The new high school standard raises the required grade level for automatic admission for an out-of-state student from 2.50 to 2.75 grade point average (GPA). A student who does not meet that requirement is also admissible from a 2.25 to 2.75 if specified test scores are combined with his GPA to meet a formula of predicted success which has been worked out by admission officers.

Basically, the formula requires the further below a 2.75 the grade point average falls (to the low limit of 2.25) the higher the test scores must be to make it possible for the student to be admitted. "This new formula for high school is bound to eliminate possible athletes," an athletic department spokesman pointed out, "but how many is impossible to predict until it has been observed in operation. We are not familiar with the operation, and until we work with it a year it would be pure guesswork to make any estimate of how many of the present members of the various athletic groups would have failed to gain admittance under the new setup."

Under the new requirements, the out-of-state college transfer level is raised from a 2.0 to a 2.25, and this basically affects junior college transfers.

The department spokesman noted: "The new requirement will probably eliminate a few transfers, but we usually don't have more than a dozen or so in the entire program each year. While it won't have much effect numerically, it could prevent the transfer of a possible key man who would have been admitted under the old standard."

For Rowing Championships

Lane County Sites Being Considered

Two reservoirs in Lane County are being considered as possible sites for the Western Intercollegiate Rowing Championships in 1965.

Col. Sterling K. Eisminger, U.S. Army District Engineer at Portland, said Tuesday he has been advised of this possibility by Karl F. Drlica, rowing coach at Oregon State University.

The 1965 rowing championships are scheduled for the Pacific Northwest, and Eisminger

said he was told by Drlica that the Western Crew Coaches Assn. is considering either Fern Ridge Reservoir or Dexter Lake on the Willamette River middle fork as possibilities.

A racing course would require a 2,000-meter straightaway with six 50-foot lanes, or a minimum of 300 feet width. Some additional length would be needed on either end of the course for maneuvering the 60-foot racing shells.

Drlica told the Register-Guard that Dexter Lake looks like a "pretty good possibility" — better than Fern Ridge — but noted that a group is needed to sponsor the races and sponsorship involves costs of \$4,000 to \$5,000. Expenses, however, can be offset by revenue from the meet, he indicated. The championships are awarded on a bid basis, he said.

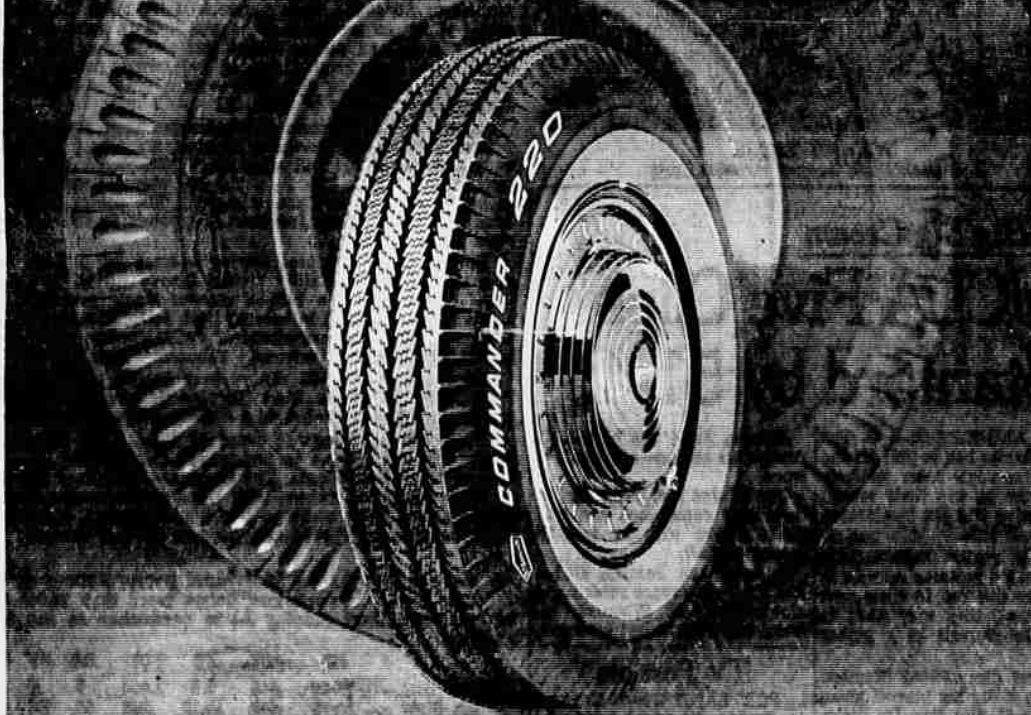
"They're reasonably good-sized, and they have quick guards who can cause you a lot of trouble," Valenti said.
