



## Committee Okays School Fund Bill

SALEM — The Ways and Means Committee of the Oregon Legislature approved a bill Friday that would eliminate the basic school fund as a continuing appropriation.

The bill would put the appropriation for aid to local school districts on the same basis as all other appropriations — made on a flat sum basis every biennium.

After the appropriation is decided on, the distribution to local districts would be made on the same basis it is now.

The bill also would take all special services out of the basic school fund appropriation and put them on a regular appropriation basis.

The measure would not necessarily mean a reduction in aid to local districts — but the amount of aid would be decided by each legislature.

## Budget Cuts Reaffirmed

SALEM — The Joint Ways and Means Committee Friday reaffirmed reduction of two budgets that had been sent back to it by the House for reconsideration.

Those two budgets were for the State Engineer and the State Soil Conservation Committee.

About \$100,000 had been cut from the State Engineer's budget, in the area of studies for watershed programs.

House members sent it back to the committee several weeks ago. Several said it had not received the hearing it deserved.

Many House members said they had been under heavy pressure from their areas to try to restore the cuts.

In a subsequent hearing on the bill, a ways and means subcommittee heard testimony from several officials of watershed, soil conservation and drainage districts. They said the watershed program would be greatly harmed if the cuts were kept in.

Also approved Friday was the Legislative Fiscal Committee budget of \$173,297, which had been trimmed \$560.

A bill increasing the limit for self liquidating dormitory bonds from \$44.5 to \$62 million also was approved.

## Statement Corrected

Eugene banker H. Sanford Saari, chairman of the United States Savings Bonds program in Lane County, said this week that a statement attributed to him in the March 21 issue of the Register-Guard was inaccurate.

The article quoted Saari as saying purchase of savings bonds makes it possible for the individual to do his part in reducing the government debt.

Actually, Saari said, his statement was that the more savings bonds that are held by the people of the country the easier it becomes for the U.S. Treasury Department to finance the government's indebtedness.

Purchase of the non-negotiable E and H savings bonds reduce the government's dependence on open market negotiable bond purchases, he said.

## Paper Textile Plant to Move

MOUNT ANGEL — A manufacturing plant for paper textile will be shut down at Mount Angel and its operations moved to Portland.

The plant employs about 50 persons with a weekly payroll of \$5,000. The closure will be sometime before July 1.

It is the Ames-Harris-Neville Co., a subsidiary of Boise Cascade Corp., R. H. Freeborn, general manager of Ames-Harris, said operations will be combined with its Portland facility at American Can Co. building, which the firm recently acquired.

The Mount Angel plant opened about one year ago.

Freeborn said all employees will be offered jobs at Portland.

Paper textiles include mesh bags, in which vegetables are sold.

## 'Round the State

### Mill Union, Operators Open Talks

PORTLAND — The Timber Operators Council and the Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union Friday opened contract negotiations.

The TOC, which represents 191 employers, asked that the present contract be changed to allow staggering of maintenance crews without overtime pay for Saturday work.

TOC said the union asked a 60-cent hourly wage increase and a three-year contract.

The employers are scheduled to meet Tuesday with the other major lumber workers union, The International Woodworkers of America.

The contracts for both unions expire June 1.

Last June both unions sought a 30-cent hourly pay increase under a wage opening agreement. Employers said that the lumber market was depressed and the IWA withdrew its demand, saying it would ask a major increase this year.

The ISWU did not formally withdraw its demand but workers continued on the job.

Karl F. Glos, executive vice president of TOC, said that general conditions had not improved materially in the last 10 months.

### Bullet Wound Fatal

THE DALLES — A bullet wound took the life Friday of Edward Richard Bisig, 31, in The Dalles hospital.

He had been shot Tuesday at the nearby community of Rufus.

Sherman County Sheriff Leo Roberts said Dolphus Baker, 53, a Rufus garage owner, told him he shot Bisig in self-defense.

Roberts said the grand jury will be called to investigate.

Roberts said Baker told this story:

Bisig's wife, Janice, 22, arrived at his garage and said Bisig had beaten her. Bisig arrived with a .22-caliber revolver in his belt and Baker got his gun. He shot Bisig when he thought Bisig was reaching for the weapon in his belt.

### Boy's Body Found

SALEM — The body of five-year-old Gene Lyle Guthrie, Salem, was found in the waters of the mill creek canal not far from his home Friday.

The body was found by two Portland skindivers, Richard Hinman and Robert Cranston, about four blocks from where the boy tumbled into the water while at play Wednesday.

The canal was probed several times by police and firemen before the water level was lowered this morning to aid searchers.

### Blossom Day Set

SALEM — The 50th annual Blossom Day will be observed Sunday in Salem.

The Salem Cherrians annually promote the day in which visitors and townspeople tour the countryside to view orchards in bloom.

A recommended route will be available Sunday from Cherrians at the state Capitol where Cherrians will guide visitors through the building.

### Golf Cart Used

PORTLAND — Thieves found a new use for a golf cart at the Colwood Golf Club Friday. They used it to wheel a 250-pound safe from the club's pro shop to a waiting vehicle and get away with about \$1,650 in cash and checks.

The club lost \$575 in another burglary March 16.

### California Firm Gets Contract

Oregon's congressional delegation reports that a California firm will be awarded a \$24,880,000 contract for construction of the Green Peter Dam and powerhouse.

They said that the Corps of Engineers will award the contract to Paul Hardeman, Inc., Staunton, Calif.

The firm will use an estimated 1,119,000 cubic yards of concrete and 600,000 barrels of cement.

The project is located on the middle fork of the Santiam River in Linn County.
