

3 Sunrise Services Set For Sunday

Three major Easter Sunday sunrise services will be held in the Eugene-Springfield area—but each of them are scheduled after sunrise.

Officially, U.S. Weather Bureau records show sunrise is due Sunday at 5:32 a.m. But Eugene's main sunrise service, an inter-denominational Protestant program at McArthur Court on the University of Oregon campus, is scheduled to begin at 6 a.m.

That's the same time as the union Protestant sunrise service at the Springfield Memorial Bldg., sponsored by the Springfield Ministerial Assn.

Conservative Baptist youth in the Eugene-Springfield metropolitan area and some neighboring communities have set 6:30 a.m. as the starting time for a sunrise service on Skinner Butte in Eugene.

The Eugene union service will feature the Rev. Jerry Pederson, chaplain to Lutherans at Portland State College, as speaker. His topic will be "Recovery of Relevant Resurrection Faith."

This service, which is open to the public, is sponsored by a number of student religious groups at the University of Oregon, including Congregational college students, Wesley Foundation (Methodist), Luther House, Westminster Foundation (Presbyterian), Christian House (Disciples of Christ), the YMCA and Roger Williams Fellowship (Baptist).

Music for the service will be provided by the South Eugene High School A Cappella Choir. Speaker at the Springfield service will be the Rev. Firman Harris, pastor of Springfield Church of the Nazarene. The Rev. Jim Orrell will be song leader.

In case of rain, the Baptist youth plan to move their service to the Harlow Chapel of First Baptist Church, Broadway and High Street, Eugene.

Speaker at the youth service will be Duncan Ferguson, First Baptist's minister of youth. His topic will be "The Relevance of the Resurrection."

Youth from the following Baptist churches are aiding in planning and presenting the service: River Road Baptist, McKendrick Baptist, Bethel-Danebo Baptist, Immanuel Baptist, Berean Baptist and First Church.

Churches Plan Special Programs

A Christmas tree, a floral cross and numerous programs with Easter recitations, music and programs by church or Sunday school students are planned Sunday in the Eugene-Springfield area and throughout the Emerald Empire.

The Christmas tree is the one used during the December holiday season at First Baptist Church, 1175 G St., Springfield.

In the period between Christmas and Easter, when the church observes Lent and the suffering of Christ, the trees dries and sheds its needles.

But on Easter Sunday, it will acquire new branches and decorations, symbolizing, the

church officials said, "new life and the Resurrection."

Floral crosses—where children from the church place flowers on a form to symbolize the same theme—will be part of the program Sunday at a number of Eugene-Springfield churches.

A traditional program of songs and recitations is planned Sunday at 9:45 a.m. at Riverview Baptist Chapel, 2335 Riverview St., Eugene.

Valley Christian Church, Rt. 1, Box 97-A, Springfield, has scheduled the Sunday school Easter program for 10 a.m.

Junior, primary and kindergarten class children at Fairfield Church of the Nazarene, 1052 Fairfield Ave., Eugene,

will present an Easter program at 9:45 a.m.

At the same hour, a children's program is scheduled Sunday at Lighthouse Temple, 1209 Olive St.

Two special programs are scheduled at Friendly Street Church of God, 23rd Avenue and Friendly Street.

At 9:45 a.m., Sunday school members will give an Easter program. At 7 p.m., members of the Youth Fellowship will present a four-act play, "Simon The Leper."

In the Emerald Empire, a number of churches will have programs Sunday, some scheduling the program for the regular Sunday school hour.

Memorial Community Church at Triangle Lake will

have its annual Sunday school Easter program at 9:45 a.m., and various Bible school departments of Coburg Christian Church, 207 Pearl St. in Coburg, will present a program Sunday at 10 a.m.

Creswell Methodist Church's program, presented by the church school classes, will be Sunday at 9:45 a.m.

Also at Creswell, the Church of Christ's primary department will give a program Sunday at 9:45 a.m.

Recitations and songs will be on the program for Easter Sunday at 10:30 a.m. at Culp Creek Assembly of God, where the youngsters from primary through junior classes will participate.

Elmira Open Bible Church will have its Sunday school

Easter program at 9:45 a.m., the same time selected for the Sunday school program at Open Bible Standard Church at Lowell. The Lowell program will include recitations, songs and readings from the Scriptures by each department from nursery through the junior class.

The Sunday school at Community Evangelical United Brethren Church at Maplewood will present its Easter program at 9:45 a.m.

Olive Baptist Church at Veneta will have its children's Easter program at 10 a.m.

At Yoncalla, the Church of Christ at Second and B Streets has scheduled a Bible school program at 9:45 a.m.

Musical Easter Worship Scheduled

Residents of Eugene, Springfield and a number of other Emerald Empire communities will have a wide choice of Easter music programs, concerts and cantatas Sunday.

"Music and the Message of Easter" will be the theme of a concert of sacred and Gospel hymns Sunday at First Baptist Church, Broadway and High Streets, Eugene.

The program, open to the public, will begin at 7 p.m. Selections by the church's sanctuary choir of 45-voices and by music ensembles from the church's music department will be accompanied by narration of the Easter story from the New Testament.

Emerald Baptist Church's adult choir Sunday will present the cantata, "A Celebration of Easter," at 7 p.m. at the church, 19th Avenue and Patterson Streets, Eugene.

Springfield Christian Church, 418 A St., Springfield, has scheduled an Easter musicale for Sunday at 8 p.m. The program will include selections by the church's three choirs: Chancel (adult) choir, Chorister (juniors) and Carol (primary) Choir.

The 35-voice choir of First Evangelical United Brethren Church, 834 Monroe St., Eugene, will present the cantata, "No Greater Love" by John Peterson, Sunday at 7 p.m. at the church.

A 20-voice choir from Willakenzie E. U. B. Church, 260 Willakenzie Rd., will present "The Anthem of the Ages," a cantata, Sunday at 11 a.m.

"Christ Triumphant," a cantata by John F. Wilson, will be given Sunday at 7 p.m. at the Eugene Salvation Army Corps, 640 W. Seventh Ave., Eugene.

This year's Easter cantata at Fairfield Church of the Nazarene, 1052 Fairfield St., Eugene, will be "The Glory of the Cross" by Rosemary Hadler.

At the same program, the church's junior high school group will present a play.

And Lighthouse Temple, 1209 Olive St., has scheduled an Easter musicale Sunday at 7 p.m. at the church.

In the Emerald Empire, many church choirs have been practicing special cantatas or anthems in preparation for Easter.

"Hallelujah! What a Saviour!" by John W. Peterson will be the cantata presented Sunday at 7:30 p.m. at the Church of Christ at Sixth and Gibbs Avenues in Cottage Grove.

The choir of Creswell Church of Christ will present a special Easter service Sunday at 7:30 p.m.

A cantata, directed by Elda Lowman, will be given Sunday at 7:30 p.m. during the regular evening service hour at Elmira Church of Christ.

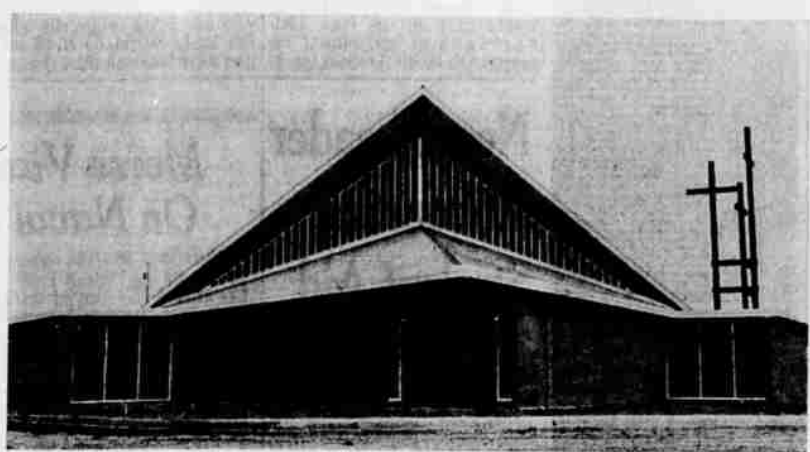

A 30-minute choir cantata will be given Sunday at 10:15 a.m. at the Church of the Nazarene, Star Route Box 37-B, Oakridge.

Olivet Baptist Church at Veneta will have an hour-long "evening of song" Sunday, beginning at 7:30 p.m.

The cantata, "Hosanna," will be given Sunday at 7:30 p.m. at Yoncalla Church of Christ, Second and B Streets, by the church choir.

Two Sanctuaries Ready

Two Eugene congregations will move into new church sanctuary buildings Sunday.

For one congregation, St. Mark's Catholic Church on Echo Hollow Road, the services will be held in the building after a long wait—one caused by a fire last September when the then newly-completed building was gutted.

For the other congregation, Wesley Methodist Church, services will mark another step in the church's gradual expansion to serve Methodists in the Willakenzie area.

Both new church buildings are of modern architectural design.

The St. Mark's building, first in a planned complex of structures to serve the new parish, features an unusual roofline and extensive use of natural materials.

Pastor C. J. Linehan said Easter services will be a Low Mass at 8 a.m. and a High Mass with music by the adult choir at 10 a.m.

St. Mark's is Eugene's fourth Roman Catholic parish. Announcement of the parish's formation from part of St. Mary's Parish was announced in September, 1961, and since late 1961, the parish members have been holding services at Mala-

bon School in the Bethel-Danebo area.

At present, there are more than 200 families on the parish membership rolls.

Wesley Methodist Church announced its plans to build a new \$100,000 sanctuary early last summer. Stafford, Morin and Longwood, of Eugene, were architects for the project.

The sanctuary, shown above, is located on the corner of Oakway and Cal Young Roads adjacent to the church's existing parish hall. It will seat 350 persons in the sanctuary.

Wesley's services will begin with a joint sunrise Easter service at 8 a.m. at Armitage Park, with members of Coburg Methodist Church participating.

Speaker for this service will be Lt. Col. Hal Brazier, U.S. Air Force. This will be followed at 7:30 a.m. by a breakfast at the Eugene church.

At 9:30 a.m., the congregation will worship in the new sanctuary for the first time. A second, and identical, Easter service is scheduled at 11 a.m.

The Rev. Luis Bove, pastor, said a service including baptism, reception of new members and confirmation is scheduled Sunday at 3 p.m.

Further events, he said, in-

clude open house April 21, a choir concert the same day by a choir from Willamette University, an organ recital April 28 and consecration of the new building May 5.

'Road to Calvary' Pageant to Be Offered Sunday

Three performances of the pageant, "The Road to Calvary," will be given Sunday at First Assembly of God, 1330 Madison St., Eugene.

The annual pageant, with 3,000 persons expected to attend this year, will be given at 6:30, 9 and 11 a.m.

In the pageant, scenes from events leading to the Crucifixion are presented with narration and appropriate vocal music.

The music is presented by a 45-voice choir, and there are 90 persons in the pageant cast. Appropriate costumes, lighting and stage settings are used in the production.

Child care will be provided for pre-school age youngsters at each performance.

"The Road to Calvary" was adapted for the stage by the Rev. Robert Pagett, assistant pastor of the church, who also serves as director of the choir.

This will be the third year that First Assembly has featured the pageant on Easter Sunday.
