

Ambitious Production UT Scores With 'J.B.'

"J.B." is the most ambitious production attempted by University Theatre in some time. Sensitively produced, directed, and performed, it is unquestionably one of the most rewarding.

With kinship lines that extend back into medieval morality and classic Greek drama, the play is illusion within illusion within illusion. Director Horace Robinson, set designer Gayle Clough, and the cast of "J.B." successfully lead the audience through the thin barriers into a new theatrical dimension and a new reality.

As everyone doubtless knows, the Archibald MacLeish poetic drama is a variation upon the theme of Job. It reaches beyond the literal specifics of existence to the central question: In a universe seemingly without justice, where evil passes unpunished and good unrewarded, what is it to be a man? Whose is the guilt? MacLeish may not provide an answer satisfactory to everyone, but he couches it in theatrical terms that never fail to excite or move.

The scene is a circus arena. A popcorn seller (Nichols) and a balloon man (Mr. Zuss) with cosmic imagination set about playing God and the devil at variance over the allegiance of a good and upright man (J.B.). The story of J.B. or (Job or Man) then unfolds.

Sister City Book Drive Under Way

A campaign to collect certain magazines and quality children's books to send to Eugene's sister city of Chinha, Korea, was launched Friday.

Members of the Eugene-Chinha Sister City Steering Committee adopted a suggestion which came from one of its members, Mrs. John Gregor, to exchange books with citizens of Chinha.

Mrs. Gregor said she has received a letter from Dr. Kim Yoon Yang indicating representative books are being collected there to send to Eugene.

In exchange, the Eugene group is seeking contributions of certain types of magazines and books to send to Chinha schools. Forrest Pitts, chairman of the Eugene committee, said he will attempt to collect representative but out-dated text books from the Eugene school system.

To go with the textbooks, the committee is seeking contributions from the public of children's good, used illustrated story books, book classics for children (such as Tom Sawyer), and books along the line of the "Dr. Seuss" series.

The committee also seeks contributions of copies of the following magazines: "Nature," "Science," "Scientific American," "National Geographic," "Natural History," "Horizons," "American Heritage," "Popular Science," "Popular Mechanics," "Boys Life," "American Girl," "Child Life," and stamp collecting and coin collecting magazines.

Books and magazines—in bundles—may be left at the council chamber of the Eugene City Hall, Pitts said.

They will be stamped with a slogan, "Eugene Friendship Book," then shipped to Chinha via the U.S. Navy's free Operation Handicap program.

The book and magazine collection drive will continue to May 15.

Pitts reported that seven University of Oregon Korean students have volunteered to translate letters that are coming to Eugene from Chinha residents through the KORE Community Awards program.

Members of clubs here sent some 180 letters to Chinha to win award points in the promotion program. Sixty or more replies have been received.

Letters which require translations may be delivered to radio station KORE, Pitts said, and they will then be forwarded to the student translators.

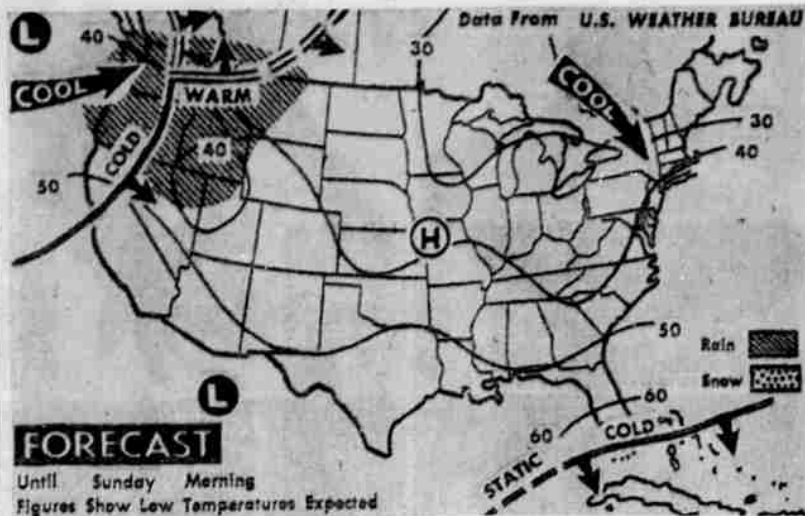

Youth Held In Mystery Sea Deaths

KEY WEST, Fla. (U.P.)—Roger Foster, 17-year-old admitted killer of the charter boat Dream Girl's two-man crew, was brought to Key West by a Coast Guard vessel Saturday and was immediately whisked away from the docks by FBI agents and county officers.

The husky youth, wearing a T-shirt and pants stained with blood, was held for 15 minutes aboard the Coast Guard cutter after its arrival, then was hurried to a waiting automobile.

Both his hands were bandaged and he appeared dazed as he was led ashore. An FBI agent held him firmly by one arm and Sheriff Henry Haskins held the other.

The cutter also towed the Dream Girl into port. Her deck was splattered with blood.

"I murdered them and threw them overboard," Foster told Coast Guardsmen when the charter boat was found Friday after a wide search, out of fuel 20 miles from the coast of Communist Cuba. The youth was alone on the deck.

He said he had killed the captain, Douglas Trevor, 47, and his son, Edward, 22, the first mate.

Foster chartered the sports fishing boat, possibly in a mad effort to reach Cuba for an attempt to assassinate Fidel Castro, after earlier attempting to kill himself in a Key West motel room.

Norman Lee Liles, 21, of 195 Van Buren St., Eugene, was arrested Friday night and charged with negligent homicide.

The charge, following a secret indictment by the Lane County Grand Jury, stems from an auto accident March 8 in which Daniel Eugene Flesher, 15, of 2697 Harvest Lane, Springfield was killed.

The accident took place on Skinner Butte in Eugene when the car Liles was driving plunged off the south side of the hill.

Bail on Liles had not been set Saturday morning. He has been lodged in the city-county jail.
