World Work Of Church Topic of Talk

A minister who travels extensively to lecture on the work and aims of the World Council of Churches will be a guest speaker Sunday at First Christian Church, 1186 Oak St., Eugene.

The Rev. Ralph W. Bolick of Bakersfield, Calif., the speaker, will be featured at the church's Sunday evening service at 7:30.

His topic will be "What in the World Is the Church Doing?"

The talk will deal with what is being done in the religious field concerning support of the United Nations, refugee relief and rehabilitation.

Bolick will use slides and motion pictures to illustrate his talk, which is open to the public.

He is a native of the Northwest, and holds degrees from Washington State College at Pullman, Huntington (Indiana) College and Theological Seminary and Boston University School of Theology.

During the Korean War, he served as a chaplain in the U.S. Air Force.

An ordained Methodist minister, he is currently president of the Greater Bakersfield Council of Churches.

Bolick was a press representative at the World Council of Churches assembly in New Delhi, India, in 1961, and attended the 1954 assembly in Evanston, Ill., in a similar capacity. He also has worked with Heifer Projects, Inc.

Gospel Crusade Planned

Plans for a Eugene-Springfield Gospel Crusade—a unified program expected to involve 40 area churches—have been announced.

The Rev. Vance Webster, pastor of First Baptist Church and general chairman for the crusade, said this week that meetings are scheduled Aug. 4-18 at South Eugene High School.

Speaker for the program, he said, will be the Rev. Charles E. Blair, pastor of Calvary Temple in Denver, Colo.

Blair, in Eugene Wednesday for an organizational meeting of ministers interested in the crusade, said there is now a "tremendous trend toward evangelism."

This, he feels, is "due to the emergencies of the times."

His own church, he explained, is not affiliated with any major church organization or denomination. Blair's personal theology he said, is "generally conservative."

In his church, he said, "we don't major on the minors," referring to theological issues.

Blair studied at several colleges and theological schools, including Southwestern in Fort Worth, Texas, and Phillips University in Enid, Okla. He was ordained 19 years ago, and has been at the Denver church since 1947.

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High Mass 'Explanation' Set Sunday

Witnesses Make It Look Easy

Meet Highly Organized

There was no "hurry-up and wait" last weekend at the circuit assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses in Eugene.

The Witnesses, old hands at holding large conventions, consider last weekend's meeting as "small"—only some 1,000 people from the Witnesses' 14 congregations in Oregon Circuit No. 2 were involved.

But throughout the convention, the organizational touches that enable the Witnesses to hold regional meetings for 20,000 persons were evident.

At every convention, the Witnesses take responsibility for feeding delegates and visitors. This is where convention experience and training of volunteers count. Some 725

persons can be served dinner, in cafeteria style, in 45 minutes.

On the opening night of last weekend's convention, the dinner line was just starting and the convention just getting under way.

But there was no long line waiting for food service, the ticket booth was running smoothly and kitchen activities seemed well-coordinated.

Still, R. C. Oster of Cottage Grove, the Witness in charge of food operations for the convention, was a little apologetic.

"This is the roughest meal," he said, "About the second or third meal, we'll get the trouble spots worked out of the operating methods."

All on Oster's food staff are

volunteers. The three cooks—male—learned their art either in the military or by working in restaurants.

During the weekend they were called on to prepare meals featuring baked ham, Swiss steak, meat loaf, braised beef tips and similar main dishes. This is served with vegetables, beverage, salad and dessert for 65 cents per meal.

Oster said the Witnesses have a food purchasing department, and that all food items are purchased from local firms.

He's organized the food section into various sections: kitchen, dishwashing, salad, serving line, expediting, food purchasing, food receiving, dining room and cooks.

Oster added that when one worker is rushed, due to the general feeling of cooperation, another volunteer "naturally" aids him.

The "department" method is used for the entire convention organization. There were 22 departments organized for last weekend's convention—ranging from the food section to parking, public relations and clean-up.

Planning on these operations, explained F. E. Adams, a supervisor for the circuit, began over a month ago. The circuit, he explained, owns some equipment "accumulated during the years" for conventions—a public address system, some of the kitchen and food-serving material and other items.

He noted the advance planning and "fine cooperation" work so well that civil defense personnel often come to Witnesses' conventions to observe the food serving operations.

A convention like the one in Eugene, Barker summed up, "seems like no trouble at all."

For the Witnesses, it probably isn't.
