Attorney General Robert Kennedy makes a guest appearance on "Issues and Answers" today at 2:30 on Channel 9.

ABC correspondents Edward P. Morgan and William H. Lawrence are scheduled to interview the guest on Justice Department responsibilities and involvement in matters concerning civil rights, juvenile delinquency and crime.
