

Space Data Center Urged

NEW YORK (AP)—Astronaut John G. Glenn Jr. proposed Monday creation of a national information center into which would be channeled the vast new quantities of space age information.

The Marine lieutenant colonel, first American to orbit the Earth, made the proposal in a speech prepared for delivery to editors and publishers at the annual Associated Press meeting.

Demos Meet, Hear Morse

SALEM (AP)—The Democratic State Central Committee elected Robert Welty, The Dalles, its new secretary Sunday.

Welty, a consulting engineer, fills the vacancy created several months ago by the death of Peter Kirk, St. Paul.

The Central Committee adopted resolutions favoring an Oregon Dunes National Park and enactment of anti-strikebreaker legislation.

At a Saturday conference attended by some 200 party members, Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., said the General Services Administration has rejected Astoria's offer to buy the Tongue Point Naval Station for \$920,000.

Morse said he was told in a letter from Bernard L. Boutin, GSA administrator, that the facility would be put up for public sale. June 24 is the tentative bid opening date, Morse said.

Morse Criticizes Nixon, Rocky

SALEM (AP)—Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., Saturday night criticized both former Vice President Richard Nixon and New York Gov. Nelson Rockefeller in a speech to Democrats here.

He called Nixon a "war-monger" and he said Nixon took "a shocking position" Saturday when he said the U.S. should "openly support the forces of freedom in its policy toward Cuba."

Morse said President Kennedy has at all times fought Communism in Cuba "within the frame work of international law."

He accused Rockefeller of a "shabby performance" in egging on French President Charles de Gaulle in hopes of embarrassing President Kennedy.

GOP Group Severs Ties

PORTLAND (AP)—The Oregon Republican College League changed its constitution Saturday to cut ties with the Young Republican Federation and attached itself to the Oregon Republican Club.

The action came at the group's annual convention here. The ORCL worked out a one-year probationary period with the ORC before a permanent affiliation will be made.

The convention turned down by a narrow margin approval of the liberty amendment, which would eliminate the income tax, and rejected a committee's recommendation that it endorse Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., for the presidency in 1964.

A move to back Gov. Mark Hatfield as a favorite son candidate was defeated when newly elected chairman Raymond J. Redburn, Coos Bay, said the league should concern itself with forming a strong organization to support all candidates and should not become involved in advance endorsements.

Publishers Study Labor Technology

Newspaper Officials Meeting in N.Y.

NEW YORK (AP)—The twin problems of labor and advancing technology held the spotlight for intensive study at the annual meeting of executives of the American daily press opening here Monday.

More than 1,400 executives from the United States, Canada, Puerto Rico, Bermuda and Jamaica were expected to attend the four-day 77th annual convention of the American Newspaper Publishers Assn. (ANPA).

Record High Membership

The organization membership stands at a record high of 867 daily newspapers - representing more than 90 per cent of total daily North American circulation—in an industry which this year has been beset with labor trouble in a time of marked gains in automated production.

Following two years of reduced strike activity, newspaper unions in 1962 called 27 strikes against 26 daily newspapers in 17 cities. Minneapolis was hit by a 117-day strike. Cleveland papers were closed by a 126-day strike. New York was blacked out by a 114-day strike-shutdown.

Implications of the space age, satellite communication, new challenges of news coverage, government policy toward the free flow of news, and congressional antitrust subcommittee hearings on the newspaper business all were prominent on the discussion agenda.

Hold Closed Sessions

The convention will end Thursday night with an address by New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller at the annual dinner of the ANPA Bureau of Advertising. It opened Monday with the annual all-day closed sessions in labor relations, with ANPA President Irwin Maier, publisher of the Milwaukee Journal and Sentinel, welcoming the participants.

In related meetings, the two press associations opened their annual get-together sessions. The Associated Press invited publishers to its annual lunch for an address by astronaut John H. Glenn. United Press International, at its annual breakfast for members of its regional editors and publishers associations, presented its chief European correspondent, Joseph W. Gregg, and its Saigon bureau manager, Neil Sheehan, with special reports on France and Viet Nam.

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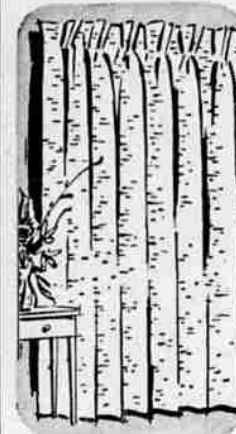


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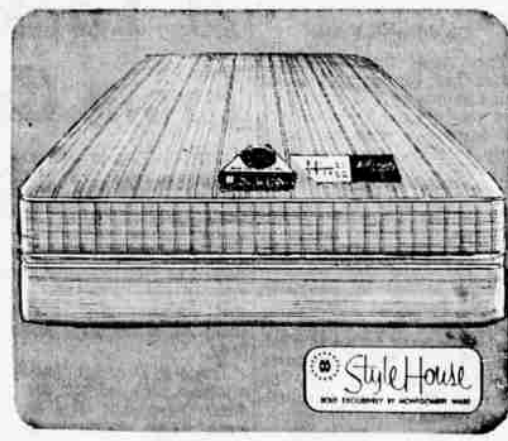
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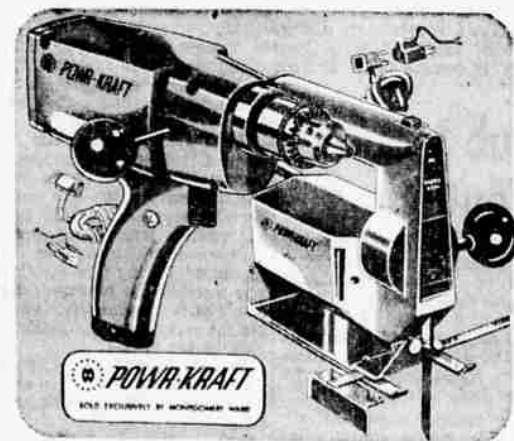
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
